Chair Dela Cruz, Vice Chair Keith-Agaran, and Members of the Committee.

The Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism ("DBEDT") **offers comments on** SB2019, SD1, which requires fuel sold in the State to contain no less than ten per cent biofuel by volume.

DBEDT is aware of the State's objective for the ultimate elimination of fossil fuel in ground transportation but notes that the move to renewable energy should be beneficial to Hawaii's economy. Act 161 in 2015 repealed the requirement that gasoline for motor vehicles sold in the State include ten percent (10%) ethanol. Act 161(15) cited that this repeal was made since the "requirement of blending ethanol into Hawaii's gasoline does *not* produce any economic benefit for the State; further, the import of ethanol *creates an economic burden* for state residents." (italics added)

Since enactment of Act 161 in 2015, DBEDT is unclear as to whether the market for biofuels, inclusive of ethanol and biodiesel, has materially and significantly changed in the State to warrant revisiting a 10 percent mandate for motor vehicle fuel. Without such confirmation, DBEDT is concerned that enactment of SB2019, SD1 may continue to "create an economic burden for state residents."

With its limited resources for staffing and funding for technical support, DBEDT is also concerned about the costs to establish and administer these program activities.

#### TESTIMONY ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2019 SD1, RELATING TO BIOFUEL

Position: Support with Modifications

To the Honorable Sen Donovan Dela Cruz, Chair; the Honorable Sen Gilbert Keith-Agaran, Vice Chair; and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to provide written testimony on house Bill No. 2019 SD1.

The Hawaii Bioeconomy Trade Association (HBeTO) is a newly forming non-profit trade association with members engaged in the production or development of integrated food, energy, and waste-re-use projects to help the State of Hawai'i meet its ambitious renewable energy and local food and fuel production goals and mandates. At the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Bioeconomy Hawaii Forum held at the Capitol in January 2018, over 120 attendees from the private, public, and non-profit sectors convened to discuss opportunities and challenges to sustainable business producing integrated food, energy, and value-added products in Hawaii and to vote on priorities for policy and industry standards and facilitation.

We give testimony in support with modifications for SB2019. Hawaii opted-in to the federal Renewable Fuel Standard mandate and adopted its rules and regulations via that option. We do not recommend the state take on the overhead and administrative cost of duplicating a 500+ page federal statute and multi-year federal program that is currently regulated through full life cycle by the EPA for each individual gallon of biofuel.

The locally grown feedstock requirement probably violates interstate commerce law. This intent can be met with current federal programs such as RFS2, which applies a carbon lifecycle to the supply chain, and therefore would factor in transoceanic transportation – therefore importation - carbon costs.

Mandatory blending is unworkable for the state's current fuel distribution system, which is all designed to distribute jet fuel and would render any jet fuel commingled with biodiesel, ethanol, or non "Drop-in" fuels unacceptable to airlines and to the FAA. Note Hawaii's existing "barrel tax" (Food and Energy Security Act) already has a blending penalty that is in effect: it is applied only to ground transportation and electrical fuels. Since biofuels are exempt, it creates a de facto credit.

HBeTO does support all facilitation and cost reduction the State can provide to make more "drop in" local renewable fuel production projects feasible and successful in the state.

#### Potential amendments:

Change mandatory at state level to refer to the current federal Renewable Fuel Standard 2 mandate [as enacted in the Energy Independence and Security Act of 2007 (EISA 2007)].

Support reconciliation of differing definitions of "Biofuel," "Renewable Fuel," and "Renewable Feedstocks" defined in at least 5 different statutes: HRS §269-91, §235-110.31, §243-1, §103D-412 and §486J-1. Have all statutes refer or use the more detailed and updated language in §235-110.31, and add a reference in "Other" within §235-110.31 to mean "any fuel approved as a renewable fuel under the U.S. federal Renewable Fuel Standard [as enacted in the Energy Independence and Security Act of 2007]."

Dear Chair Dela Cruz and Members of the Committee on Ways and Means:

On behalf of the Alliance of Automobile Manufacturers ("Alliance"), we submit this testimony regarding SB 2019 SD 1, which proposes to require that fuel sold in the State for use in motor vehicles contain a minimum of 10% biofuel. The Alliance is a trade association of twelve car and light truck manufacturers including BMW Group, Fiat Chrysler Automobiles, Ford Motor Company, General Motors Company, Jaguar Land Rover, Mazda, Mercedes-Benz USA, Mitsubishi Motors, Porsche, Toyota, Volkswagen Group of North America, and Volvo Car USA.

The Alliance wishes to express very serious concerns about SB 2019, SD1. While newer vehicles, post-2010, can operate on fuel that is 10% biofuel, pre-2010 motor vehicles are not engineered to operate on any fuel that contains more than 5% biofuel. These vehicles can operate on E10 ethanol blends, but not biofuels. Even for newer vehicles, the biofuel must meet an ASTM standard. No standard is set out in the bill.

The bill in its present form creates a significant and uncapped liability to the State. If a 10% biofuel mixture is required, thousands of older vehicles will be damaged. Since it would have been state action that caused this harm, and since that harm would have been knowingly caused by the state government, it would seem that the State would be liable to those owners of motor vehicles that were damaged as a result of this state action. It would also seem that the State would be liable to those owners who choose not to drive their vehicles to avoid the risk of damaging their vehicles to at least the extent of the market value of such vehicles.

Because of the foregoing, if the committee decides to move the bill, it is recommended that a fund be established to compensate motor vehicle owners for their losses. That fund should be substantial given the many thousands of cars and trucks that are likely to be damaged.
