pathways, academies, or programs operated within a department of education school, to engage in commercial enterprises, including the sale of goods produced by or for an individual school, career pathway,

academy, or program. (SB2051 HD1)

Department's Position:

The Department of Education (Department) supports SB 2051, SD1, HD1 which would allow an individual department school or any career pathway, academy, or program operated within a school, to engage in commercial enterprises that are related to their primary educational purposes, including the sale of goods produced by or for an individual school, career pathway, academy, or program.

The Department's Community Engagement Office (CEO) is charged with the responsibility of stewarding Connect 2 Careers (C2C), a statewide partnership formed to build, measure, and scale high-quality work-based learning experiences for students which align with local, county, and state economic and labor market needs.

SB 2051, SD1, HD1 aligns with the Department's Strategic Plan for student success in college, career, and citizenship. This measure will enhance the rigor and relevance of work-based learning throughout the P-20 continuum as students engage in comprehensive, real-world immersive experiences particularly in the areas of entrepreneurship and strategic commercial enterprise.

Aloha Honorable Representatives Luke, Cullen, and Committee members:

I am Disa Hauge, principal of Wai'anae High and I am requesting your support of SB2051: Relating to Education as it will allow the sale of school products and services to be cycled back into the school's programs. This will enhance our ability to increase the rigor and relevance in our curricula which prepare students to take their place in our society, ready for college and careers.

The better we are able to facilitate students' engagement in relevant, real-world experiences, the more thoroughly and at a higher level is their understanding of the content. Towards this end we provide students with many real-world experiences such as ogo production in the Marine Science Learning Center (MSLC), media production in Searider Productions, 'Farm to Table' produce and eggs in the agricultural program, and catering in our culinary program. This bill will allow us to incorporate entrepreneurial curricula and experiences into their programs with administrative rule oversight.

The scale at which a school can produce items and services for sale means that we are unable to compete commercially with private enterprise. For example, we only have space for a dozen chickens and students are available to cater only periodically. Most importantly, we are an educational enterprise and we fully expect that each cohort of students will learn best by building their own products and services, which necessarily means that we fully expect to often not turn a profit, just like a start up business.

Ogo sales out of our Marine Science Learning Center will be cycled back into our programs would allow us to expand the program and support field trips to valuable resources such as our island's fishponds and Coconut Island. Imagine if Wai'anae High students developed a mechanism to replenish our 'anae, or mullet? They are currently studying the feasibility of establishing just such a hatchery.

Our school is in the process of developing an overarching business curriculum for all of our programs. It will include business planning, human resource management, financial systems, and regulatory compliance. We have no intentions of competing with community businesses as we fully expect student-run quasi-businesses in a school setting to be a microcosm in which students can safely make entrepreneurial mistakes.

Administrative rules will lay out requirements for our programs. We expect to be in compliance with all DOH regulations relating to food preparation and safety, for example. As a school, we are in the process of developing an elective class that conducts mock-OSHA and DOH inspections, 'fines' companies, collects 'taxes', analyzes our operations, and issues End of Year Financial Reports.

Thank you for your consideration in support of SB 2051 SD1. It will support our efforts to provide our students with real-world experiences that prepare them for their place in our community.
