To the Honorable Mike Gabbard, Chair; the Honorable Gil Riviere, Vice-Chair and Members of the Committee on Agriculture and Environment:

Good afternoon, my name is Melodie Aduja. I serve as Chair of the Oahu County Legislative Priorities Committee of the Democratic Party of Hawaii. Thank you for the opportunity to provide written testimony on Senate Bill No. 2110, relating to the disposal of used motor oil at automotive parts retail stores. The OCC Legislative Priorities Committee is in favor of Senate Bill No. 2109 and support its passage.

Senate Bill No. 2110, is in alignment with the Platform of the Democratic Party of Hawai'i ("DPH"), 2016, as it requires retail automotive parts stores to accept used motor

oil for recycling or disposal and allows a retail automotive parts store to collect a fee for the actual cost of disposal or recycling.
