Title of Bill: SB 2381 RELATING TO SCHOOL CLOSURES.

Purpose of Bill: Allows school principals to close the school due to natural disaster

without needing to consult the complex area superintendent if

conditions are deemed unsafe for students and faculty.

Department's Position:

The Department of Education does not support SB 2381 allowing school principals to close the school due to a natural disaster without needing to consult the complex area superintendent if conditions are deemed unsafe for students and faculty. School principals should routinely consult with the complex area superintendent to ensure the proper chain-of-command is notified and that significant decisions determined. Consulting with complex area superintendents also ensures compliance with the National Incident Command System (NIMS) as required by Homeland Security Presidential Directive 5 (HSPD-5). However, school principals do have the right to evacuate their respective schools in cases of imminent danger such as natural disasters (i.e., tsunami lands within 30 minutes, etc.) In such cases, each school has Emergency Action Plans (EAP) that provide specific procedures for evacuations and all emergencies to ensure the safety and security of school employees and students.
