Chair Dela Cruz and Members of the Committee:

The Department of the Attorney General provides the following technical comments on this bill.

The purpose of this bill is to create a special fund for the department of agriculture industrial hemp pilot program. The proposed statutory amendment includes the following subsection:

(c) Moneys deposited into or appropriated to the special fund shall remain available until they are obligated or until the special fund is terminated.

This subsection could be interpreted as allowing funds to be expended from the special fund without the need for an appropriation. Pursuant to article VII, section 5 of the Hawaii State Constitution, money may not be expended from a special fund unless an appropriation is made out of that fund.

To resolve these concerns, we recommend amending the bill by deleting subsection c, found on page 2, lines 12-14, in its entirety.
