A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the current
- 2 educational requirements for application for licensure as a
- 3 mental health counselor are overly specific, which has prevented
- 4 some otherwise qualified individuals from gaining licensure.
- 5 The purpose of this Act is to amend the practicum
- 6 experience qualifications for licensure as a mental health
- 7 counselor to accommodate different coursework structures, while
- 8 ensuring the overall educational requirements remain at an
- 9 appropriate level.
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 453D-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- "(a) An applicant shall be issued a license by the
- 13 department if the applicant provides satisfactory evidence to
- 14 the department that the applicant is qualified for licensure
- 15 pursuant to the requirements of this chapter and meets the
- 16 following qualifications:

TESTIMONY ON SENATE BILL NO. 2647, H.D. 2, RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELORS.

TO THE HONORABLE ROY M. TAKUMI, CHAIR, AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE:

My name is Carol Kramer, and I am the Executive Officer of the Mental Health Counselor Program, Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("Department"). Thank you for the opportunity to testify in strong support of S.B. 2647, H.D. 2, Relating to Mental Health Counselors, with a suggested amendment.

This measure amends the practicum experience requirements for qualifications for licensure as a mental health counselor. The Department respectfully requests that the Committee amend this bill to restore the effective date to July 1, 2018.

The Program concurs with generalizing the practicum experience requirement by amending the law to require a total of at least six semester hours or ten quarter hours within at least two academic terms, instead of at least three semester hours or five quarter hours per academic term. The total practicum experience hours will remain the same, providing no change to consumer protection.

Thank you for the opportunity testify in strong support of S.B. 2647, H.D. 2, and amending it to have an effective date of July 1, 2018.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony.

I am testifying in strong support of SB2647. HD2 with one amendment

SB2647, HD2 does not reduce the number of practicum hours already required. Rather, it provides the opportunity for otherwise qualified individual whose universities have a different approach to how their students practicum classes have been structured to be eligible for licensure in Hawaii.

This bill as originally written (effective July .2005), with minor exceptions, followed fairly closely the requirements for graduation to receive a master's degree in counseling as stated in the National Certified Counselors (NCC) required course work..

The NCE exact requirement states:

"9. Counseling Field Experience (minimum six semester/10 quarter hours) Studies in this area provide supervised counseling experience in an appropriate work setting)".

The amendment requested is to change the effective date from July 1, 3000 to July 1, 2018.

Please pass this bill out of committee with the amendment. Thank you.
