### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 103D-110, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§103D-110 Education and training. (a) The department of
- 4 human resources development, either alone or in cooperation with
- 5 any governmental body, including the department of labor and
- 6 industrial relations, or in cooperation with other states, the
- 7 federal government, or other persons may:
- 8 (1) Conduct or participate in procurement education and
- 9 training for persons not employed by the State; and
- 10 (2) Sponsor a purchasing certification program conducted
- by a voluntary organization of procurement
- 12 professionals.
- 13 (b) The state procurement office, in cooperation with the
- 14 department of human resources development, shall develop and
- 15 maintain a procurement practices training and development
- 16 program for procurement officers of [the State and the several
- 17 counties, any governmental body, to ensure that an agency's



- 1 procurement practices are in compliance with the procurement
- 2 code and that proper procurement decisions are made consistent
- 3 with this chapter. The program shall [include a] be mandatory
- 4 [fundamental training and development session and follow-up
- 5 training and development sessions.] and shall be completed by
- 6 the procurement and contracting workforce delegated to procure
- 7 before they may engage in or authorize any procurement. The
- 8 procurement and contracting workforce delegated to procure shall
- 9 complete mandatory review training every three years thereafter;
- 10 provided that anyone who fails to do so shall no longer have the
- 11 authority to procure.
- 12 For purposes of this subsection, "contracting workforce"
- 13 shall include but not be limited to members of any committee or
- 14 group responsible for evaluating requests for proposal.
- 15 (c) [Each state procurement officer of a department of the
- 16 executive branch shall attend a mandatory fundamental training
- 17 and development session within sixty days of being appointed or
- 18 named to the position of procurement officer.] With the
- 19 exception of the administrator of the state procurement office,
- 20 each chief procurement officer, executive department head, and

1 their deputies shall attend a mandatory fundamental training 2 session within ninety days of being appointed. 3 (d) Each state procurement officer of a department of the executive branch whom the state procurement office determines is 4 5 in need of further training and development based upon: The history of procurement compliance to this chapter 6 (1) 7 by the agency to which the particular procurement 8 officer is attached; or 9 (2) Any other need for training and development, 10 shall attend follow-up training and development sessions. 11 [(e) Attendance by state procurement officers at the 12 follow-up training and development sessions, other than as 13 required under subsection (d), and by county procurement 14 officials at the fundamental and follow-up training and 15 development sessions is optional, though encouraged.] " 16 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 18 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to update training modules and implement the training for the procurement 19

workforce of the State.

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the state
- 2 procurement office for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 6 provided that section 2 shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

#### SENATE BILL 2913, SD 1 RELATING TO PROCUREMENT

Chair Johanson, Vice Chair Holt, and members of the committee, thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony on SB 2913, SD 1. The State Procurement Office (SPO) strongly supports the intent of the bill to ensure delegated procurement officers and procurement contracting workforce receive training.

To be effective, procurement training must be provided to all personnel conducting or participating in procurement and the training must be targeted to their role. Most departments do not centralize their procurement function resulting in hundreds of personnel who conduct or participate in procurements each year.

In addition, the SPO supports that delegated procurement and contacting workforce be required to complete mandatory review training every three years to ensure that they are accustomed to any new procurement guidance's within the procurement code. In order for a successful program to all departments and governmental agencies needs to track each of their employee's trainings to prevent any lapsing of their procurement delegation.

The amendment to the existing statute is necessary, because the procurement workforce need much more training than a mandatory fundamental training and developmental session to be taken within sixty days of being named to the position of procurement officer. The field of procurement is varied and complex, and changes constantly, thus creating a need for a full Body of Knowledge to be studied rather than a merely attending a single session.

The SPO is working on developing a robust certification program to enhance and uplift procurement as a professional career field, and training is an integral part in advancement of the procurement workforce to enable successful contracts.

The SPO is recommending the following amendment to Section 1, page 2, lines 7 to 11.

"The procurement and contracting workforce delegated to procure shall complete mandatory review training every three years thereafter; provided that anyone who fails to do so shall no longer have the authority to procure, all department and governmental agencies shall be responsible to keep track of their employee's trainings to ensure all training requirements are met.

CHAIRPERSONS JOHANSON AND LUKE, VICE CHAIRS HOLT AND CULLEN AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEES.

S.B. 2913, S.D. 1 refers to Section 103D-110, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and is amended to read: S103D-110 Education and Training. (a) The Department of Human Resources Development, either alone or in cooperation with any governmental body, including the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, or in cooperation with other states, the federal government, or other persons may:

- Conduct or participate in procurement education and training for persons not employed by the State; and
- Sponsor a purchasing certification program conducted by a voluntary organization of procurement professionals.

The Department of Human Resources Development **does not** support this amendment.

The Department of Human Resources Development is solely responsible for the training of individuals employed by the State of Hawaii. In addition, the State

Procurement Office (SPO) should be responsible for the training of any persons in procurement training as subject matter experts. The SPO is currently responsible for this type of training and should continue to be for its expertise in this specialized area.
