Title of Bill: SB 2970 RELATING TO EDUCATION.

Purpose of Bill: Appropriates funds to the University of Hawai'i at Manoa, University of

Hawai'i at Hilo, and Ka Papahana Kaiapuni program to collaborate to establish professional qualifications and develop training programs for

the Ka Papahana Kaiapuni program's staff.

Department's Position:

The Hawai'i Department of Educations (Department) supports the intent of SB 2970, with suggested amendments. The Department recognizes that there are two colleges at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa that provide the necessary training required for preparation of Kaiapuni teachers. We look forward to further dialogue regarding any appropriations in relationship to this bill.

The Department suggests the following changes:

1) Replace the language on Page 2, Line 9 to Line 15 to read as follows:

"The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa College of Education to work collaboratively with Kawaihuelani Hawaiian language college; and the University of Hawai'i at Hilo's Ka Haka 'Ula '0 Ke'elikōlani, Kahuawaiola indigenous teacher education program; and Ka Papahana Kaiapuni program to establish professional qualifications and develop training programs for the Ka Papahana Kaiapuni program's staff."

2) Insert language on Page 2, Line 19, to read:

"the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa College of Education and Kawaihuelani Hawaiian Language College."

TESTIMONY By Kaʻanoʻi Walk Kamehameha Schools

E nā Luna Hoʻomalu Shimabukuro a me Kahele, nā Hope Luna Hoʻomalu Galuteria a me Kim, a me nā Lālā Kenekoa o kēia mau Kōmike ʻelua, aloha! My name is Kaʻanoʻi Walk and I serve as the Senior Policy Analyst of the Kūamahi Community Education Division of Kamehameha Schools.

We are writing to <u>support</u> SB 2970, relating to education. This measure appropriates funds to the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, University of Hawai'i at Hilo, and Ka Papahana Kaiapuni program to collaborate, to establish professional qualifications and to develop training programs for Ka Papahana Kaiapuni program staff. Ka Papahana Kaiapuni provides students of all ethnicities a Hawaiian bicultural and bilingual education through the medium of 'ōlelo Hawai'i and is essential to the continuation of our Hawaiian language and culture.

Kamehameha Schools advocates for and supports the achievement of Hawai'i's Native Hawaiian public school students. As such, in 2016, Kamehameha Schools formed a partnership with the Hawai'i Board of Education ("Board") to identify mutual alignment of efforts for Hawai'i's Public Education System. One such area is the Board's policy on Ka Papahana Kaiapuni (105-8). As articulated in the policy, Ka Papahana Kaiapuni's success "is largely dependent on the capacity, capability and expertise of the program's professional staff." Furthermore, "the goals is for program professionals to be qualified in both English as a medium of instruction and Hawaiian as a medium of instruction and appropriately compensated for these additional qualifications." Adequate resourcing is necessary in order to further the goals and expectations set forth in the Board's Ka Papahana Kaiapuni policy.

Founded in 1887, Kamehameha Schools is an organization striving to advance a thriving Lāhui where all Native Hawaiians are successful, grounded in traditional values, and leading in the local and global communities. We believe that community success is individual success, Hawaiian culture-based education leads to academic success and local leadership drives global leadership.
