### **RELATING TO INNOVATION BUSINESS**

Senate Bill No. 3000, S.D. 2: establishes the Research and Development (RD) Program in the Hawaii Technology Development Corporation to help Hawaii-based small businesses optimize research and development performed in Hawaii; establishes the RD Special Fund; appropriates an unspecified amount of general funds for FY 19 to be deposited into the RD Special Fund; and appropriates an unspecified amount from the RD Special Fund for FY 19 to carry out the purposes of the program.

While the Department of Budget and Finance takes no position on the RD Program, as a matter of general policy, the department does not support the creation of any special fund which does not meet the requirements of Section 37-52.3, HRS. Special funds should: 1) serve a need as demonstrated by the purpose, scope of work and an explanation why the program cannot be implemented successfully under the general fund appropriation process; 2) reflect a clear nexus between the benefits sought and charges made upon the users or beneficiaries or a clear link between the program and the sources of revenue; 3) provide an appropriate means of financing for the

program or activity; and 4) demonstrate the capacity to be financially self-sustaining. In regards to Senate Bill No. 3000, S.D. 2, it is difficult to determine whether the proposed special fund would be self-sustaining.

It should also be noted from a technical aspect that Senate Bill No. 3000, S.D. 2, contains no source of revenue for the proposed RD Special Fund.

We are currently performing R&D on a variety of exciting ocean technology projects, including autonomous underwater vehicles, ocean thermal energy conversion (OTEC) and seawater air conditioning (SWAC) systems, submarine and subsea cable systems, and a Department of Energy project to grow and harvest macroalgae (seaweed/limu) offshore in Hawaiian waters to produce a renewable biofuel alternative for transportation.
