Aloha Chair Dela Cruz, Vice Chair Keith-Agaran, and Members of the Committee:

I am Randy Cabral, President of the Hawaii Farm Bureau (HFB). Organized since 1948, the HFB is comprised of 1,900 farm family members statewide, and serves as Hawaii's voice of agriculture to protect, advocate and advance the social, economic and educational interests of our diverse agricultural community.

The Hawaii Farm Bureau agrees with the intent of SB 3030, which establishes a farmer mentoring program.

Hawaii's farmers and ranchers are aging. The average age exceeds 60 years old and if they were in other professions would be retired. Yet many of these farmers are those that provide to Safeway, Times, Costco and truly make a difference in reducing imports. Unfortunately for many, succession plans do not exist and as they retire, the lands go out of agricultural production. There is an urgent need for interns or apprentices that are willing to not only work on these farms but take over their operations.

Soil health is only one aspect of being a successful farmer. Knowledge of regulations, finances, and marketing are just a few of the areas that are required to ensure that farmers are viable. We respectfully request that the <a href="mailto:mentorship">mentorship include other areas of training</a> so the intern or apprentice will be provided a well-rounded experience of what it takes to be a successful farmer in Hawaii.

#### Re: S.B. No. 3030 Relating to Agriculture

SB3030 proposes to appropriate funds to the Department of Agriculture for a farmer apprenticeship mentoring program that shall teach farmers about methods to improve soil health by using whole farm systems.

The Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, through funding provided by the Legislature, has supported the development of curriculum using whole farm systems in our public schools as part of an effort to increase the workforce pipeline in the agriculture industry.

The Department of Labor and Industrial Relations <u>supports the intent</u> of this measure but defers to the Department of Agriculture for any administrative or budgetary implementation concerns.
