In consideration of SENATE BILL 3048 RELATING TO CONSERVATION OFFICER AND RESOURCES ENFORCEMENT TRAINING

Senate Bill 3048 proposes to appropriate moneys to the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) for the establishment of a training academy for its Division of Conservation and Resources Enforcement (DOCARE) Officers. **The Department supports this measure.**

The Department notes that DOCARE lacks a centralized training venue to conduct both new hire recruit level training and in-service training for employees. As a result, there is no common core of knowledge, and employees have varying degrees of training depending on past law enforcement employment.

DOCARE aims to develop a full cadre of officers committed to conservation and resources enforcement in particular, beyond general law enforcement. A training academy would allow DOCARE to train entry-level officers in the full range of conservation and resources law enforcement from the ground up. It would also assist in the hiring of officers who currently do not possess the experience necessary to qualify as a lateral hire, and in ongoing common core conservation and resources enforcement training for current officers. This should increase the applicant pool and move DOCARE closer to fully staffing the Division with officers commonly trained in conservation and resources enforcement.

My name is Lance Uchida, 58 year old born and raised resident of Oahu and I'd like to thank you for taking time to consider this testimony. My Dad wasn't an avid fisherman or diver but, when I was very young, he did take me to the beach whenever possible -- and I can still remember those times. Like so many others, these experiences developed into a love and appreciation of these sports and the Ocean itself. Things sure have changed. Oahu's population has exploded. I can't believe how much things have changed in just my lifetime. Central Oahu and Ewa look nothing like how it did a few decades ago. The pressures put on the resources is backbreaking. Hiking trails are packed with cars and people, fishing and diving is no longer such a lonesome endeavor (there are alway people at your once "secret" spot now). I've been involved with a number of diving and fishing forums and one thing has surprised me -- that so many fishermen and divers are supportive of conservation measures to protect the resourses. They are aware of the regulations and restrictions, they know what those restrictions are trying to accomplish and they get upset when they see those regulations being broken. This last point is always a topic -- enforcement. We all know the limits that the DLNR faces. Enforcement takes money. But without enforcement, the regulations mean nothing, will accomplish nothing, and will create frustration between the citizens and the government and between those citizens that comply and those that don't. Decades ago, when I was young and was starting out diving, I never saw turtles. Ever. Then legislation was enacted to protect them. Now, almost any time you go to the beach, you'll see turtles, and you'll see people excited to experience them. Conservation can work. It may take decades to see a difference, but it can work -- but the regulations need teeth. We owe it to future generations not to be selfish today, but to invest now and help them experience what Hawaii has to offer. I ask for your support of SB3048.
