SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 164 SD1
REQUESTING THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE TO SUBMIT A RECOMMENDED
DEFINITION OF "AGRICULTURAL HUB" OR "FOOD HUB" AND, IN
COLLABORATION WITH THE AGRIBUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION,
IDENTIFY AREAS IN THE STATE THAT ARE POTENTIALLY SUITABLE TO BECOME
AGRICULTURAL HUBS OR FOOD HUBS.

Chairperson Creagan and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on SCR 164 SD1 that has two requests. The first request is for the Board of Agriculture to submit a recommended definition of "agricultural hub" or "food hub" to the 2019 Legislature. The definition should include language that reflects that the hub is a centrally-located facility with a business management structure facilitating the aggregation, storage, processing, distribution, and marketing of locally produced food products. The second request is that the Board of Agriculture and the Agribusiness Development Corporation identify areas in the State that are potentially suitable to become agricultural hubs or food hubs. The Department of Agriculture offers comments.

Section 205-2(d)(15)(E) already defines a "food hub" as: "a facility that may contain a commercial kitchen and provides for the storage, processing, distribution, and sale of agricultural products grown in Hawaii and value-added products that were produced using agricultural products grown in Hawaii." This facility is permitted throughout the State Agricultural District.



As for the location of potential "food hubs" throughout the State, the "Statewide Agricultural Land Use Baseline (2015)" has identified the Whitmore complex as a "food processing hub" (page 57) for local farmers such as those that may establish agricultural operations on the 1,200 acres of former Galbraith Estate agricultural land in Central Oahu now owned by the Agribusiness Development Corporation. We are also aware of a project by Aloun Farms called the Ohana Farm Parcels, a 427-acre condominium property regime just north of Whitmore Village. Farms on this property may benefit from a "coordinating entrepreneur" who will also offer a centralized processing, storage, and distribution facility on site.

Identifying the location of other potential food hub sites throughout the State may need to consider the amount of agricultural production needed to sustain the core operations of a food hub facility. Existing farmers will have to be convinced that entering into a relationship with a food hub is advantageous enough to cause them to no longer sell their products through existing channels. In the case of new agricultural lands being offered to agricultural operations as is the case with the "Whitmore Project," perhaps a modular approach to food hub development would reduce the risk of developing a food hub with over-capacity for the throughput available. In either case, private and public investors will expect their return-on-investment to meet their expectations.

Testimony in FAVOR of Senate Concurrent Resolution 164

Aloha Chair CREAGAN, Vice-chair DECOITE, and Committee Members,

The development of food hubs in Hawaii is critical to increasing the availability of locally produced food. The vast majority of farms in our state are small farms whose production is generally too small and too inconsistent to serve most retail, institutional and restaurant markets. As a result these farmers only grow what they know they can sell and are then relegated to farmers markets and roadside stands to sell their goods.

North Shore EVP is addressing this issue in two ways. First we have initiated a USDA GAP certification program for small farms, the first of its kind in Hawaii. We know that large buyers of local produce will soon require food safety certification and compliance with the Food Safety and Modernization Act (FSMA). The process takes about a year to complete, but without food safety certified farmers and a critical mass of participating farms, a food hub is of little use.

Second, we are in the process of planning a food hub to serve North Shore farmers from Waikane to Waialua. The facility will buy directly from food safety certified farmers and will aggregate, clean, pack, market and distribute produce from the region. We expect to have enough certified farms within a couple of years to open the facility and are looking forward to providing small farms access to currently inaccessible large food markets across the state.

North Shore EVP supports the state's participation in the development of food hubs however we urge your committee and the entire legislature to keep a focus on supporting small farms in their efforts to stay in compliance with new food safety regulations. Without certified farms, food hubs will not succeed.
