Good morning. My name is Melodie Aduja. I serve as Chair of the Oahu
County Committee ("OCC") on Legislative Priorities of the Democratic Party of Hawaii. Thank you for the opportunity to provide written testimony on SCR26 relating to Emergency Alerts; Federal Communications Commission; Cellular Phones; and Requirements.
