SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 59 URGING THE AGRIBUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION TO START A FARM APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM

Chairperson Gabbard and Members of the Committee:

My name is James Nakatani, Executive Director of the Agribusiness Development Corporation ("ADC"). The ADC supports Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 59 that urges the Agribusiness Development Corporation to start a Farm Apprenticeship Program.

The ADC believes that farmer proficiency and operational competency is crucial for agriculture development and is closely tied to consistent and safe food production.

Towards that goal, ADC requires its farmers to meet the following standards:

- (1) United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) and Good Handling Practices (GHP);
- (2) United States Food and Drug Administration's (FSA) Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA);
- (3) Migrant and Seasonal Agricultural Worker Protection Act (MSPA); and

(4) United States Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Agricultural Worker Protection Standard (WPS).

However, ADC has found that many of Hawaii's farmers struggle to meet the above standards, so it fully endorses the concept of a replicable education/training framework to develop the necessary skills for success. ADC also feels that the proposed support from the University of Hawaii's College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources (CTAHR) extension program is essential for program continuity and long-term success.
