- 2. Develop and maintain a planned approach to financial growth to ensure a sustainable source of income.
- 3. Promote parent and community involvement as stakeholders in the school's success.

As a public school of choice, students of Ke Kula 'o Samuel M. Kamakau, LPCS reside in districts throughout the island of O'ahu. A majority of students (66%) reside in Ko'olaupoko while others travel from Honolulu, Ka'a'awa, and the Leeward districts.



She also works closely with any state agencies, county offices and the charter school offices to ensure compliance. No GIA State funding is being requested to compensate staff or the board for the completion of this project.
