HSG, JUD, FIN

Directs the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation to immediately initiate negotiations with the owners of the Front Street Apartments affordable housing project to acquire the property. Requires the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation to exercise its power of eminent domain if an agreement with the owners cannot be reached within a reasonable time. Requires report to Legislature. Appropriates funds.

HB544 RELATING TO LIABILITY.

WLH, JUD, FIN

Provides that the State or a county that repairs or maintains a street of which the ownership or jurisdiction is in dispute between the State and the county, shall be immune from liability for personal injuries or property damage arising out of the repair or maintenance of that street. Deems that maintenance of a street shall not confer ownership or jurisdiction over such street, if the ownership or jurisdiction over the street is in dispute between the State and the county.

HB545 RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

WLH, JUD, FIN

Specifies that a government agency does not assume ownership or jurisdiction over a disputed road solely through maintenance or repair activities. Authorizes the State to quitclaim ownership of roads in favor of counties.

HB546 RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUOR.

EDB, CPC, FIN

Permits a class 18 small craft producer pub licensee to manufacture not more than 125,000 barrels of malt beverages on the licensee's premises during the license year. Clarifies that a class 14 brewpub licensee or class 18 small craft producer pub licensee may conduct certain activities at satellite locations other than the licensee's primary manufacturing premises under certain conditions. Clarifies the definition of "growler". Allows direct shipment of all forms of liquor, rather than just wine, by certain licensees.

HB547 RELATING TO FARMS.

AGR/EDB, FIN

Creates an exclusion from income tax for the lesser of fifty-one per cent of gross annual income or \$50,000 of gross annual income earned by a farmer from farming activities.

HB548 RELATING TO THE TRANSIENT ACCOMMODATIONS

TIA/WLH, FIN

TAX.

Increases the allocation of funds from transient accommodations tax revenue to the special land and development fund to improve certain state resources and services.

REFERRAL **HB549** RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT. EEP, JUD Requires new developments to plan for the impacts of projected sea level rise and prohibits development in areas significantly affected by projected sea level rise. HB563 RELATING TO A COAL-FREE HAWAII.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Prohibits the issuance of covered source air permits for coalburning electricity generation facilities after 2022. Prohibits the approval of a new, modified, or renewed power purchase agreement for electricity generated from coal.

HB564 RELATING TO THE STATE SHRIMP.

TIA, FIN

Establishes the 'opae 'ula as the state shrimp to protect anchialine pool ecosystems throughout Hawaii.

HB565 RELATING TO DISCLOSURE OF COASTAL HAZARDS.

WLH/EEP, CPC,

FIN

Requires that a vulnerable coastal property statement accompany the sale of a vulnerable coastal property. Requires that mandatory seller disclosures in real property transactions include identification of residential real properties located within

a sea level rise exposure area.

HB566 RELATING TO ENERGY.

LAB, EEP/TRN,

FIN

Requires state agencies to fully implement statutorily established energy efficiency and environmental standards for state facilities, motor vehicles, and transportation fuel, except in situations where the standards may jeopardize public health and

safety or conflict with emergency situations.

HB567 RELATING TO DIGITAL CONTENT BLOCKERS.

IAC, JUD/CPC,

FIN

Requires persons who manufacture, sell, offer for sale, lease, or distribute a product that makes content accessible on the Internet to include digital blocking capability that renders human trafficking hubs, child pornography, revenge pornography, and pornographic material inaccessible. Requires these persons to establish and maintain a reporting system for content that is improperly blocked and applicable content that is not blocked. Allows consumers to disable the blocking capability if the consumer fulfils requirements, including paying a fee for deposit in the human trafficking victim services fund. Establishes the misdemeanor offense of intentionally failing to include digital blocking capability. Establishes the human trafficking and child exploitation prevention special fund to provide grants for

various purposes. Effective 7/1/2020.

<u>HB568</u> RELATING TO HOUSING.

HSH, JUD, FIN

Establishes a three-year pilot program which authorizes nonprofit organizations in a county with a population of 500,000 or more to provide shelter to homeless persons, including by hosting temporary encampments on property owned by the organization. Prohibits the host county from enacting ordinances designed to deter the provision of shelter. Limits county liability.

<u>HB569</u> RELATING TO LITTERING.

EEP, JUD, FIN

Increases the maximum civil penalty for littering from \$500 to \$1,000. Increases the maximum fine for the offense of criminal littering from \$1,000 to \$5,000.

HB570 RELATING TO CHILDREN.

HSH, JUD, FIN

Establishes in the department of the attorney general a child abuse investigation unit. Allows the department of the attorney general to intervene in adjudications in family court. Enacts the Uniform Child Witness Testimony by Alternative Methods Act, which authorizes courts to allow for children to testify in a place other than an open forum or away from the finder of fact, court, or parties. Requires the court and the prosecution to take appropriate action to ensure a prompt trial in order to minimize the length of time a child abuse victim or minor witness must endure the stress of the child's involvement in the proceedings.

HB571 RELATING TO TAXATION.

WLH/EEP, FIN

Provides a temporary, refundable tax credit to owners of real property for albizia tree trimming or removal performed under certain conditions. Applies to taxable years beginning after 12/31/2019, but shall not be available for taxable years beginning after 12/31/2021

beginning after 12/31/2021.

<u>HB572</u> RELATING TO LICENSE PLATES.

TRN/PVM, FIN

Exempts recipients of gold star family member license plates from paying a fee for the license plates.

RELATING TO TUITION WAIVERS.

PVM, LHE, FIN

Allows the University of Hawaii system, including the community colleges, to waive tuition for spouses and children of deceased members of the United States military and who qualify

for a gold star lapel button.

HLT, JUD/CPC, Authorizes and regulates the manufacturing of edible cannabis **FIN** products as manufactured cannabis products by licensed medical cannabis dispensaries. Establishes standards, including regulations and education protocols, for edible cannabis products. Requires cannabis and manufactured cannabis products to include a universal symbol, developed by the department of health, to identify any product containing cannabis. Requires the department of health to implement a cannabis product recall system. **HB584** RELATING TO ADOLESCENT MENTAL HEALTH HLT, CPC, FIN SERVICES. Prohibits health plans and providers from disclosing to a policyholder or other covered person any payment or billing information for a minor's mental health services if the minor received the services without the consent or participation of the minor's parent or legal guardian. Specifies that the minor and the minor's parent or legal guardian are not responsible for outof-pocket payments for minor-initiated mental health treatment or counseling services. RELATING TO PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS.
