HB721 RELATING TO UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII

DEVELOPMENTS.

Allows the University of Hawaii to enter into public service ventures and establishes an Office of Strategic Partnerships and Development (OSPD) to specifically oversee and manage public service ventures to benefit the University of Hawaii.

Appropriates funds for OSPD staff.

HB722 RELATING TO PALLIATIVE CARE.

HLT, FIN

Establishes the culturally competent palliative care pilot program to promote palliative care, gather health care utilization data, and conduct bidding for at least two pilot programs for home or community based palliative care, one of which must be located in a county with less than two hundred thousand residents. Requires reports to the legislature. Establishes an advisory group to oversee implementation of the pilot program.

Appropriates funds.

Establishes employment first as a state policy with respect to disabled persons. Requires state and county agencies to implement this policy in hiring and all programs and services administered or funded by the State or counties. Applies employment first principles to Medicaid home- and community-based waiver programs.

HB748 RELATING TO PROPERTY FORFEITURE.

JUD, FIN

Prohibits civil asset forfeiture by reason of the commission of a covered offense, to the extent of the property owner's interest, unless the covered offense is a felony for which the property owner has been convicted. Prohibits the forfeiture of an animal prior to the disposition of criminal charges. Requires the Attorney General to distribute one half of all forfeited property and the sale proceeds thereof to the Hawaii law enforcement assisted diversion program, with the remaining half to be distributed to the state general fund.

SUSTAINABILITY PROGRAM.

Extends the nursing facility sustainability fee program to 2021. Allows the nursing facility sustainability fee to be used to enhance capitated rates for the purpose of paying quality incentives. Increases the nursing facility sustainability fee limit from four to 5.5 per cent of net patient service revenue. Increases the per resident daily maximum fee from \$13.46 to \$20 for each facility, and increases the per resident reduced daily maximum fee from \$5.85 to \$9 for facilities that meet certain exceptions. Appropriates funds.

HB750 RELATING TO AQUATIC BIOSECURITY.

EEP/WLH, FIN

Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to charge an aquatic biosecurity risk assessment service fee and conduct activities to detect and prevent the introduction or spread of alien aquatic organisms. Appropriates funds for staffing and operating expenditures for aquatic biosecurity.

Specifies the factors the Department of Transportation and the counties must take into account when setting maximum speed limits on a road. RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. **HB757** TRN, JUD, FIN Requires the department of transportation and the county transportation departments to adopt a vision zero policy that seeks to prevent and ultimately eliminate all traffic fatalities through a combination of engineering, enforcement, education, and emergency response strategies that focus on equity. Establishes positions within the Agricultural Resource Management Division. Authorizes GO bonds. Makes an appropriation.

HB770 RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR FIN

THE BENEFIT OF THE HONALO MARSHALLING YARD. Appropriates funds for a capital improvement project for the

Honalo marshalling yard.

HB771 RELATING TO AQUACULTURE. AGR, FIN

Appropriates funds for operational expenses for revitalizing the aquaculture development program within the department of

agriculture.

HB772 RELATING TO HARBORS. TRN, WLH, FIN

Requires harbors under the jurisdiction of the DLNR and DOT to provide entry and mooring for small vessels during times of

inclement weather and dangerous ocean conditions.

HB773 RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, LHE, FIN

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM.

Establishes the office of creative media industries Hawaii in statute, and provide that the Hawaii film office shall be an agency of that office. Renames the Hawaii Television and Film Development Board as the Creative Industries Hawaii Advisory Group. Renames the Hawaii Television and Film Development Special Fund as the Creative Media and Film Infrastructure Special Fund. Expands funding sources for the Creative Media and Film Infrastructure Special Fund to support creative industries development within the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism. Amends the purposes for which the Creative Media and Film Infrastructure Special Fund may be used. Establishes and appropriates funds for positions. Appropriates funds for operations and programs.

REFERRAL **HB774** RELATING TO THE ALTERNATIVE ENERGY RESEARCH EEP, EDB, FIN AND DEVELOPMENT FUND. Appropriates funds into and out of the alternative energy research and development revolving fund for the Hawaii technology development corporation to provide grants. RELATING TO THE STATE OF HAWAII MUSEUM OF HB775 TIA, FIN NATURAL AND CULTURAL HISTORY. Appropriates funds to the Department of Accounting and General Services for the purpose of renovations relating to artifact storage and fire suppression and protection at the State of Hawaii Museum of Natural and Cultural History. HB776 RELATING TO COMMERCIAL MARINE LICENSES. WLH/TRN, CPC, Authorizes the DLNR to create different types of commercial FIN marine licenses. Clarifies that commercial marine licenses are required of all charter and guide services regardless of whether they are tied to a vessel. Exempts commercial marine licenses from the licensing sanctions for student loan default. RELATING TO RECORDATION TRANSACTION FEES. HB777 WLH, JUD, FIN Expands the uses and application of the transaction fee for filings in the Bureau of Conveyances authorized under Act 120, Session Laws of Hawaii 2009 and Land Court. Clarifies that the transaction fee shall be repealed on the effective date of the administrative rules adopted by the Department of Land and Natural Resources that include the establishment of a transaction fee or on July 1, 2022, whichever occurs first. HB778 RELATING TO FOOD SUSTAINABILITY. AGR, FIN Appropriates funds to the Department of Agriculture for the acquisition of a mobile animal harvesting unit. RELATED TO AQUATIC RESOURCES. HB779 WLH, FIN Authorizes the department of land and natural resources to use in-lieu fee mitigation to restore, create, enhance, or preserve aquatic habitats or resources as compensatory mitigation. RELATING TO HAWAIIAN AS AN OFFICIAL LANGUAGE WLH, JUD, FIN **HB780** OF THE STATE OF HAWAI'I. Requires that the Hawaiian version of a law be held binding if the law in question was originally drafted in Hawaiian and then translated into English. Requires that 'okina and kahako be used, when appropriate, in documents prepared by or for state or county agencies or officials.

HB781 RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

LHE, LMG, FIN

Requires the Auditor to perform a financial and management audit of the Department of Education, Superintendent, Board of

Education, and complex areas every three years.

HB782 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

AGR, EEP, FIN

Appropriates funds to establish a foreign agriculture small equipment pilot program to identify efficient agriculture equipment and retrofit engines to meet the United States Environmental Protection Agency's standards.

HB783 RELATING TO EDUCATION.

LHE, FIN

Exempts remote schools from the weighted student formula. Provides that remote schools will be funded based on categorical allotments that guarantee the funding of a minimum number of instructional and support staff positions to ensure that no less than minimum course requirements are maintained. Defines "remote school". Appropriates funds.

HB784 RELATING TO THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY.

TIA, EEP, FIN

Requires and appropriates funds for the Hawaii tourism authority to promote Hawaii's efforts to protect the environment, marine life conservation districts, and coral reefs and provide guidance on the dangers of sunscreens that contain oxybenzone and octinoxate and how tourists can help protect Hawaii's

environment.

HB785 RELATING TO MINIMUM WAGE.

LAB, FIN

Increases the minimum wage rate to \$15.00 per hour and requires the State to contribute \$2.00 per hour per employee to employers with 25 or fewer employees beginning 1/1/2022.

HB786 RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH EXAMINATIONS.

PVM, JUD

Prohibits a court from committing a defendant to a suitable facility for a mental health examination for more than 30 days. Provides that if the required examinations cannot be conducted within 30 days, the court shall determine whether the defendant is eligible for supervised pretrial release or should be remanded to the custody of the Department of Public Safety. Provides that the court has continuing discretion to approve any agreement or stipulation of the parties to determine the fitness of a defendant to proceed with less than the number of required examinations.

Committee REFERRAL HB787 MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO RESTORE ADULT HSH/HLT, FIN DENTAL BENEFITS TO MEDICAID ENROLLEES. Makes an appropriation to the department of human services to restore adult dental benefits to medicaid enrollees. Requires federal matching funds. **HB788** RELATING TO THE STATEWIDE TRAFFIC CODE. TRN, JUD Requires a law enforcement officer to cite any person who operates a motor vehicle that does not display a current, valid vehicle registration tag or emblem and a current, valid safety inspection sticker as prescribed by statute. **HB789** RELATED TO INSURANCE. HLT, CPC, FIN Requires insurance coverage after December 31, 2019, for the costs of transportation to the continental United States for medically necessary treatment for qualifying patients. **HB790** RELATING TO MARRIAGE. HSH, JUD Raises the minimum age requirement to enter into marriage from sixteen to eighteen years of age. Removes the parental consent and written approval by the family court requirements for a minor to marry. Requires, rather than permits, the family court to declare void the marriage contract on the ground that the parties, or either of them, had not attained the legal age of marriage at the time of the marriage. Removes spousal cohabitation after the parties attain legal age as an exception for an annulment based on nonage. Makes conforming amendments. HB791 RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR FIN THE BENEFIT OF THE FORTY-SEVENTH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT. Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects for the benefit of the 47th Representative District. RELATING TO USE OF FORCE. HB792 PVM, JUD

Justifies the use of deadly force if an actor is in the actor's home when another person remains unlawfully in the home, and there is an imminent threat of physical harm, bodily injury, or assault.

REFERRAL **HB793** RELATING TO POLYSTYRENE FOAM CONTAINERS. CPC, JUD, FIN Prohibits the sale of polystyrene foam containers and serving of prepared foods using polystyrene foam containers statewide. Authorizes the Department of Health to adopt rules to implement the prohibition and include within its administrative rules a requirement for food vendors to educate their customers about proper disposal of nonreusable food containers and litter reduction. **HB794** RELATING TO MARINE LIFE CONSERVATION WLH/EEP, JUD, DISTRICTS. FIN Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to establish the Hau'ula Beach Park Marine Life Conservation District. **HB795** RELATING TO MARINE LIFE CONSERVATION WLH/EEP, JUD, DISTRICTS. FIN Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to establish the Laniakea Beach Marine Life Conservation District. Prohibits certain ocean recreation activities within the District. **HB796** RELATING TO MEMORIALS. PVM, FIN Appropriates funds for the planning and design of a memorial to honor service members of the recent conflicts in the Persian Gulf, Iraq, Afghanistan, and the various theaters of the Global War on Terrorism, to be located at the Hawaii State Veterans Cemetery in Kaneohe, on the island of Oahu, and replicas of the memorial to be located at state veterans cemeteries statewide. Appropriates funds. RELATING TO TELECOMMUNICATIONS CARRIERS. CPC/JUD **HB797** Requires telecommunications carriers to block calls to residential phone lines and personal mobile phone lines made from telephone numbers that do not match any of the telephone numbers of certain excepted entities as a means to curb scam calls.
