SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND OTHER AGENCY AND COMMUNITY STAKEHOLDERS TO CONTINUE MEETING AS A WORKING GROUP FOR SEXUAL VIOLENCE PREVENTION EDUCATION IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

WHEREAS, sexual violence remains a serious and ongoing
 threat to the safety and health of children and young people in
 the State; and

5 WHEREAS, more than half of sexual violence survivors who 6 receive services at Hawaii's sexual assault centers reported 7 that they experienced their abuse before the age of eighteen 8 years; and

10 WHEREAS, the United States Centers for Disease Control and 11 Prevention's Hawaii Youth Risk Behavior Survey for 2013, 2015, 12 and 2017 indicated that children and young people in Hawaii 13 experience sexual violence at rates equivalent to or higher than 14 their mainland counterparts, and in some Hawaii counties these 15 rates are substantially higher than elsewhere in the United 16 States; and

18 WHEREAS, the Hawaii State Commission on the Status of Women 19 and Arizona State University Office on Sex Trafficking 20 Intervention's 2019 report, "Sex Trafficking in Hawaii: The 21 Stories of Survivors", recommended that Hawaii adopt public 22 school sexual violence prevention education as a preventative 23 measure to protect students from being trafficked; and 24

WHEREAS, the Department of Education and Board of Education
are committed to the tenets of Title IX and have significantly
invested efforts in developing more robust systems to
investigate and respond to allegations of sexual assault,

bullying, harassment, and other forms of sexual violence in 1 public schools; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the Department of Education's Hawaii Content and 4 Performance Standards III includes a content area entitled 5 "Promoting Safety and Preventing Violence and Unintentional 6 Injury" that addresses violence prevention as a priority risk 7 topic; and 8 9 WHEREAS, implementation of a program for sexual violence 10 prevention education in public schools is important to protect 11 children and young people in the State and position the 12 Department of Education's Title IX and anti-bullying efforts up 13 for success; and 14 15 WHEREAS, prevention-oriented child sexual abuse programs 16 for public school students, school personnel, and parents and 17 quardians, known as "Erin's Law" after an Illinois survivor of 18 19 child sexual abuse, have been implemented at the state- and district-level in thirty-five other states and the Territory of 20 Guam and are under consideration by the remaining fifteen 21 states; and 22 23 WHEREAS, in October 2018, the Department of Education 24 established a working group to collaborate with other 25 stakeholders to review Hawaii public schools' current 26 prevention-oriented child sexual abuse programs and resources 27 and initiate recommendations to enhance integrated, 28 comprehensive and sustained support to ensure the well-being of 29 30 our youth; now, therefore, 31 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature 32 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2019, the House of 33 Representatives concurring, that the Department of Education and 34 other agency and community stakeholders, including 35 representatives from the LGBTQ community, are encouraged to 36 continue meeting as a working group for sexual violence 37 prevention education in public schools; and 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 40 to submit a report on updates of its progress and any policy and 41 resource recommendations to the Legislature and Board of 42
