SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAII DEVELOPMENT DISABILITIES COUNCIL TO
CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO COORDINATE ALL SERVICES PROVIDED
TO INDIVIDUALS WITH INTELLECTUAL AND DEVELOPMENTAL
DISABILITIES AND THEIR FAMILIES.

1 WHEREAS, the State has a responsibility to provide support
2 and services for individuals with intellectual and developmental
3 disabilities, so that these individuals may live self-determined
4 lives; and

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6 WHEREAS, several State departments are responsible for
7 various support and services to individuals with intellectual
8 and developmental disabilities; and

10 WHEREAS, lack of coordination among the services and
11 planning activities of the various State departments results in
12 gaps in the spectrum of needed services, duplication of
13 services, lack of clarity in responsibility for services, and
14 poorly articulated inter-agency programs, thereby reducing the
15 quality of programs for individuals with intellectual and
16 developmental disabilities; and

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18 WHEREAS, because of specific mandates of the departments,
19 it is essential that a body responsible for coordinating
20 services and planning for individuals with intellectual and
21 developmental disabilities be established outside the
22 departments responsible for support and services; and

24 WHEREAS, community participation is a major goal of the
25 State, thus state and county agencies should adopt policies and
26 regulations that will support individuals with intellectual and
27 developmental disabilities and their families to fully
28 participate in their communities; and

30 WHEREAS, family support is another major goal of the State
31 when providing families of children with disabilities the
32 support services necessary to support the family, including



1 enabling families of children with disabilities to nurture and
2 enjoy their children at home; enabling families of children with
3 disabilities to make informed choices and decisions regarding
4 the nature of support, resources, services, and other assistance
5 made available to the families; and supporting family caregivers
6 of adults with disabilities; now, therefore,

8 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature
9 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2019, that the Hawaii
10 Developmental Disabilities Council is requested to convene a
11 working group to coordinate all services provided to individuals
12 with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their
13 families; and

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested
16 to coordinate the services of the following:
17

- 18 (1) Developmental Disabilities Division of the Department
19 of Health;
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- 21 (2) Division of Vocational Rehabilitation of the
22 Department of Human Services;
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- 24 (3) Med-QUEST Division of the Department of Human
25 Services;
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- 27 (4) Disability Compensation Division of the Department of
28 Labor and Industrial Relations;
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- 30 (5) Workforce Development Division of the Department of
31 Labor and Industrial Relations; and
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- 33 (6) Workforce Development Council; and
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35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the Hawaii Developmental
36 Disabilities Council is requested to provide advice and
37 recommendations to the impacted divisions and council on how to
38 improve provision of services and the application process to
39 individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities and
40 their families, including but not limited to:

- 42 (1) Tests and procedures used to determine eligibility;

- 5 (3) Content of service plans for eligible individuals;

- 12 services supporting individuals with intellectual and

- 15 (7) Any other areas that would or could contribute to a
- 16 more consumer-responsive system of service and
- 17 support; and
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19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the impacted divisions and
20 council are requested to report to the working group on these
21 factors, including quantified data, if applicable, no later than
22 October 1, 2020; and



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24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested
25 to submit a report to the Legislature of its findings and
26 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, no later
27 than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session
28 of 2021; and

32 Human Services; Director of Labor and Industrial Relations;


