Papahana Kuaola (PK) is an aina based educational organization focused on restoration of our cultural values, practices, health and people.

Papahana Kuaola is committed to creating a functional model of economic sustainability and environmental health in which Hawaiian knowledge is the means of decision-making to ensure we perpetuate Hawaiian culture and native ecosystems. PK's approach to cultural sustainability is through the development and operation of educational programs on the property.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;
To purchase the re-assignment of a 30 year lease that includes all property assets so that Papahana Kuaola can build a long term strategy for improvements that include a hydroponic farm that will provide sustainable income for programs.

3. The public purpose and need to be served;

The public purpose is to ensure the future sustainability of Papahana Kuaola's multi-faceted programs that look to ensure that the future we build today will sustain us into tomorrow; Focusing upon economic self-sufficiency without sacrificing ourselves and our relationships to 'aina; Focusing upon environmental sustainability through direct community engagment with the natural environment and not restricting them from it with no trespassing signs. Most importantly we do it in a way that has meaningful impact on their personal lives. Hawaiian knowledge provides the course of action. With these things in mind we look forward to developing the following projects ...

1)'lli 'ilikauhale is our base project as it builds the foundation for all projects to follow. 'Ili'ilikauhale is located entirely in and deals directly with our 63 acre parcel being leased from KSBE in He'eia. This is the center of our educational and community programming, our administrative center, a test site for economic sustainability projects and the future site of a kauhale, complete with a contemporary function- specific house complex and a resident 'ohana . Our goal: to restore and reestablish relevant aspects of the kauhale system of human and natural resource relationship and management to our 63 acre He 'eia parcel. We intend to use this model in the development of curriculum and the implementation of meaningfull educational programs. Targets: Native Hawaiian students (primarily 7th grade-university), families, cultural groups and practioners, community organizations and other Hawai' i residents. Geographically, we will primarilly focus on the residents of He 'eia and the greater Ko'olaupoko district .

2) Kupualau is our curriculum and program development initiative. It is an integral part of every project we undertake. At its core, Papahana Kuaola educates and advocates for a healthy Hawai'i, focusing on people and our relationship to 'aina and each other. Education is our primary purpose. Therefore, we look at every opportunity as an educational opportunity. Curriculum development is key to the educational experience we provide. Basically, we have established general educational goals that are age specific and cater to a variety of contact situations which are intensive daily contact, once a week involvement, monthly workdays and one-time fieldtrips. We will aim to maximize contact hours and favor contact situations with multiple visits. Goal: to produce and implement educational programs and curriculum that emphasizes modern issues and problemsolving skills through Hawaiian knowledge. Targets: Native Hawaiians, lifelong learners, families, cultural groups, community organizations and other residents. Geographically our focus will be centered but not limited to the Ko'olau areas.

3)Lelekamanu is our outreach and service project division and encompasses a variety of educational opportunities that occur outside of the ahupua'a of He'eia. These include field trips to marine and terrestrial conservation areas and active restoration sites, partnering with other community organizations on malama 'aina-based initiatives and participating in native vegetation restoration projects throughout Hawai'i and the Pacific. Goal: to take the lessons of Papahana Kuaola to the wider community, with emphasis on restoration projects that improve ecological, cultural and physical health and well-being. Targets: elementary schools, communities, civic clubs, service groups and companies.

4)Hanaola is our sustainable living project. Built upon the lessons of Papahana Kuaola, these economic endeavors aim to reach a broad market with products that are innovative while exemplifying a lifestyle respectful of kanaka, 'aina and akua. Eventually, we will look to this project to sustain our efforts in 'lli'ilikauhale, Lelekamanu and Kupualau while providing much needed diversification to our island. Goal: to provide a model of innovative economic development that is environmentally sustainable and culturally minded. Targets: local, national and international markets.

 The target population includes all children, youth, families and seniors who
 are interested in preserving our precious natural resources.

To date, we have cared for over 70 acres of land, reforested over 10 acres, serviced over 150,000 contacts representing over 500,000 hours of community support through our projects. We believe that this demostrates that our communities are hungry for services that we offer, fueled by the desire to take care of our few remaining cultural and natural resources.

Beyond the growth of the overall program, PK has secured outside resource services to help manage and ensure all appropriate labor and fiscal laws are adhered to. Primarily, this comes in the form of outsourced Human Resource department and Bookkeeping.

PK has a long term vision and has successfully implemented the organizational plan up to date.

PK is constantly monitoring performance through data collection, pre and post surveying of students that enter the program and analysis of data. In addition, PK compiles quarterly and annual reports that address operational objectives, numbers served and outcomes.
