### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE FUNDS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the global
- 2 respiratory disease pandemic named "coronavirus disease 2019",
- 3 or COVID-19, has deeply impacted Hawaii's health and economy.
- 4 The COVID-19 pandemic has resulted in a statewide stay-at-home
- 5 order, a mandatory fourteen-day quarantine for travelers, and
- 6 the closing of all nonessential businesses. In April 2020,
- 7 Hawaii's unemployment rate increased to an unprecedented
- 8 thirty-five per cent with businesses reportedly reducing their
- 9 workforces by about two hundred twenty thousand workers during
- 10 the COVID-19 economic shutdown. Nearly a third of these
- 11 businesses also reported that their revenue has been reduced to
- 12 essentially zero during the shutdown.
- In expectation of an economic downturn, the State Council
- 14 on Revenues lowered its fiscal year 2021 forecast from four per
- 15 cent to zero per cent, meaning that the State will have about
- 16 \$225,000,000 less in revenues than expected.

## H.B. NO. 517 S.D. 1

As constitutionally required, the state commission on 1 2 salaries convened and reported to the legislature in 2019 the recommended increased salary adjustments for officers of the 3 executive and judicial branches of state government for the 4 following six years and members of the legislature for four 5 years. The legislature did not disapprove the commission's 6 7 recommendation by adoption of a concurrent resolution in 2019. Implementation of the commission's salary recommendations began for the executive and judicial branches on July 1, 2019, with the second of six planned raises for the executive and 10 judicial branches scheduled for July 1, 2020. The first 11 recommended raise for members of the legislature is scheduled 12 for January 1, 2021. 13 14 Due to the unprecedented economic downturn resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic, the legislature believes that continued 15 implementation of the commission's recommendations for the 16 executive and judicial branches, and planned adjustments for the 17 legislature, is irresponsible at this time and should be 18 deferred. 19 The purpose of this Act is to defer the implementation of 20

the commission on salaries recommendations until July 1, 2021.

SECTION 2. (a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary

- 1 (12) Labor and industrial relations;

- 15 (b) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary and
- 16 notwithstanding the legislature not disapproving the commission
- 17 on salaries' recommendation for salary increases by adoption of
- 18 a concurrent resolution in 2019, beginning on January 1, 2021,
- 19 and continuing through June 30, 2021, the annual salaries of
- 20 members of the legislature shall remain at the salary rate as of
- 21 June 30, 2020; provided that on July 1, 2021, the salaries of

- 1 the legislators shall be adjusted pursuant to the salary
- 2 recommendations of the commission on salaries to the level they
- 3 would have been on January 1, 2021, without the delay under this
- 4 Act; provided further that the salary recommendations of the
- 5 commission on salaries for legislators effective January 1,
- 6 2022, and each year thereafter through January 1, 2024, shall
- 7 become effective on that date in accordance with the
- 8 recommendations.
- 9 (c) This section shall not be enforced to the extent that
- 10 it is preempted by federal law.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
