A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL OPERATING BUDGET.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Due to rampant medicaid fraud that was
- 2 occurring in the 1970s, each state that accepts federal medicaid
- 3 funding is required to establish a medicaid fraud unit. The
- 4 mission of the medicaid fraud unit is to investigate and
- 5 prosecute medicaid provider fraud and patient abuse or neglect
- 6 that occurs in health care facilities or in board and care
- 7 facilities.
- 8 These medicaid fraud units receive seventy-five per cent of
- 9 their budget from the federal government and twenty-five per
- 10 cent from their respective state. In Hawaii, the medicaid fraud
- 11 unit has been able to recover enough money through settlements
- 12 in large, multistate medicaid civil fraud cases to cover the
- 13 State's share of the medicaid fraud unit's budget. However, as
- 14 these large multistate cases continue to decrease, this funding
- 15 approach will make the medicaid fraud unit's budget less
- 16 predictable. In fact, it appears that Hawaii's medicaid fraud

- 1 unit will soon not receive sufficient national civil recoveries
- 2 to cover the state match. Further, the balance of available
- 3 funds from these sources will likely be depleted in August 2020.
- 4 Most states' medicaid fraud units currently receive
- 5 budgeted funds through legislative appropriations for the
- 6 medicaid fraud unit match. The process to appropriate these
- 7 funds has been further disrupted by the Coronavirus Disease 2019
- 8 pandemic. However, an alternative source of funding, excess
- 9 funds in the DNA registry special fund, has been identified to
- 10 provide a bridge for fiscal year 2021. The transfer of moneys
- 11 out of the DNA registry special fund will not have an adverse
- 12 impact on that special fund.
- 13 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to transfer moneys
- 14 from the DNA registry special fund to the medicaid
- 15 investigations recovery fund in order to cover the State's
- 16 funding obligation for the medicaid fraud unit.
- 17 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the DNA registry
- 18 special fund the sum of \$500,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 19 necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 to be deposited into the
- 20 medicaid investigations recovery fund established under section
- 21 28-91.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 1
- 2 the attorney general for the purposes of the medicaid
- investigations recovery fund. 3
- SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
