STATEMENT OF OBJECTIONS TO SENATE BILL NO. 2206

Honorable Members Thirtieth Legislature State of Hawai'i

Pursuant to Section 16 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Hawai'i, I am returning herewith, without my approval, Senate Bill No. 2206, entitled "A Bill for an Act Relating to Homelessness."

The purpose of this bill is to authorize the Board of Land and Natural Resources to issue month-to-month revocable permits for temporary emergency sheltering of and facilities for homeless persons on state lands under certain conditions.

This bill is objectionable because, as written, it may expose the State to liability. There are also concerns regarding extra costs in the event of a default where the Department of Land and Natural Resources could incur significant personnel costs for eviction enforcement as well as expenses for removal of abandoned structures and any remediation required to address the unauthorized land uses.

For the foregoing reasons, I am returning Senate Bill No. 2206 without my approval.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the COVID-19
- 2 pandemic has endangered lives around the world. Amid threats to
- 3 people's well-being, concerns about an overextended health care
- 4 system, and record numbers of unemployed individuals,
- 5 communities have come together to create emergency areas to
- 6 house and help those who are homeless.
- 7 The legislature further finds that COVID-19 will likely
- 8 continue to pose risks to Hawaii until an effective treatment or
- 9 vaccine is developed, and given these risks, it is unsafe to
- 10 remove people from established emergency homes and services.
- 11 The legislature finds that ensuring public safety is
- 12 paramount, and it is in the public interest to assist emergency
- 13 homeless camps to temporarily provide shelter due to COVID-19,
- 14 persistent homelessness, and a severe economic downturn in the
- 15 State.
- 16 The purpose of this Act is to ensure the safety of those
- 17 individuals in emergency homeless camps by authorizing the board

4	SECT	ION 2. (a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary,
5	the board	of land and natural resources may issue month-to-month
6	revocable	permits to be used for the temporary emergency
7	shelterin	g of and facilities for homeless persons on state lands
8	under con	ditions, including rent amounts that will serve the
9	best inte	rest of the State; provided that:
10	(1)	Any revocable permit issued pursuant to this Act shall
11		be exempt from chapter 171, Hawaii Revised Statutes;
12	(2)	A revocable permit may only be issued pursuant to this
13		Act if the person to whom the revocable permit is
14		issued has a written agreement or partnership with the
15		State or any political subdivision thereof; and
16	(3)	A revocable permit shall not be issued for lands under
17		the control or management of the department of
18		agriculture until the board of land and natural
19		resources has obtained the prior written agreement of

the department of agriculture.

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- 1 (b) A person to whom a revocable permit is issued pursuant
- 2 to this Act shall endeavor to meet all applicable state and
- 3 county requirements, or if noncompliant due to the nature of the
- 4 emergency, shall demonstrate good faith planning and progress to
- 5 achieve and maintain compliance, or seek alternative locations
- 6 for the long term sheltering of homeless persons.
- 7 (c) Each person to whom a revocable permit is issued or
- 8 who resides on state-owned land leased pursuant to this Act
- 9 shall, in writing, waive, release, indemnify, and hold harmless
- 10 the State of Hawaii, its officers, agents, and employees from
- 11 and against any and all claims arising out of or resulting from
- 12 the lease or occupancy; provided that the written waiver,
- 13 release, indemnification, and holding harmless provided pursuant
- 14 to this subsection shall survive the repeal of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval
- 16 and shall be repealed ninety days after the last day of the
- 17 disaster emergency relief period specified in the governor's
- 18 final supplementary proclamation relating to the COVID-19
- 19 emergency, irrespective of any separate proclamation terminating
- 20 the disaster emergency relief period in the governor's final
- 21 supplementary proclamation relating to the COVID-19 emergency.
