STATEMENT OF OBJECTIONS TO SENATE BILL NO. 2523

Honorable Members Thirtieth Legislature State of Hawai'i

Pursuant to Section 16 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Hawai'i, I am returning herewith, without my approval, Senate Bill No. 2523, entitled "A Bill for an Act Relating to Public Safety."

The purpose of this bill is to require the Department of Public Safety ("PSD") to spend \$450,045 from its fiscal year 2020-2021 appropriation to fund a contract for a specific "community-based work furlough program for women." This bill prohibits PSD from spending any of its appropriation for the 2020-2021 fiscal year until the \$450,045 is expended.

This bill is objectionable because payments for the furlough program are made periodically throughout the fiscal year rather than in an up-front, lump-sum payment. The requirements of this bill, therefore, would prohibit all other expenditures from PSD's fiscal year 2020-2021 appropriation because it is impossible to expend the entire \$450,045 on the work-furlough program until the end of the fiscal year. In addition, PSD would be unable to pay the administrative costs to implement the furlough program itself, which is the purpose of this bill.

For the foregoing reasons, I am returning Senate Bill No. 2523 without my approval.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature recognizes the importance of 1
- 2 the community-based work furlough program for women. Since
- 3 2015, the department of public safety has contracted with a
- local nonprofit organization to place up to twenty-three women 4
- 5 from the women's community correctional center on Oahu in a
- 6 residential program that provides a supportive environment
- geared towards re-entering society and rebuilding their lives. 7
- The residential program's job readiness and job retention 8
- 9 programs enable women to return to the workforce, keeping
- 10 eighty-four per cent of participants out of prison.
- In June 2020, the department of public safety announced 11
- that budget cuts, necessitated by the revenue loss caused by the 12
- 13 economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, would require
- 14 cancellation of its contract with the nonprofit organization and
- end the program on June 30, 2020. 15
- 16 Contrary to claims made by the department of public safety,
- the budget passed by the legislature shows no reductions to the 17

- 1 operating budget of the women's community correctional center
- 2 that would impact the ability to provide contracted services.
- 3 Budget reductions for all state agencies were based on vacant
- 4 positions within each department, not appropriations for other
- 5 current services or contracts. Furthermore, after factoring in
- 6 vacant position reductions, the women's community correctional
- 7 center (PSD409) received a net increase of \$1,550,443 for fiscal
- **8** year 2020-2021.
- 9 SECTION 2. Act 5, Session Laws of Hawaii 2019, as amended
- 10 by House Bill No. 2200 H.D 1, S.D. 1, passed by the legislature
- 11 during the regular session of 2020, is amended by adding a new
- 12 section after section 6.5 to read as follows:
- "Section 6.6. Provided that of legislative appropriation
- 14 item I-19 for the department of public safety for fiscal year
- 15 2020-2021 in section 3 of this Act, the general fund sum of
- 16 \$450,045 shall be expended from the fiscal year 2020-2021 budget
- 17 (PSD900, general funds) by the department of public safety for
- 18 the purposes of the community-based work furlough program for
- 19 female inmates; provided further that no other funds
- 20 appropriated for PSD900 in section 3 of this Act shall be

- 1 expended until the requirements of this section are
- 2 implemented."
- 3 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act, upon its approval, shall take effect
- 5 retroactive to June 30, 2020.
