### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTRIC VEHICLES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. The purpose of this part is to amend Act 168,
3	Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, as amended, and extend its repeal
4	date.
5	SECTION 2. Act 168, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, section
6	2, as amended by Act 143, Session Laws of Hawaii 2019, section
7	3, is amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
8	"(b) An electric vehicle on which an electric vehicle
9	license plate is affixed shall be exempt from payment of parking
10	fees, including those collected through parking meters, charged
11	by any state or county authority in this State, except that this
12	exemption shall not apply:
13	(1) For more than two and one-half hours of metered
14	parking, or the maximum amount of time the meter
15	allows, whichever is longer; [ <del>or</del>

1	<del>(2)</del>	To parking fees assessed in increments longer than one

2	SECTION 5. Chapter 291, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
3	amended by adding a new sections to part IV to be appropriately
4	designated and to read as follows:
5	"§291- Enforcement. Each county may adopt ordinances
6	to enforce the requirements of section 291-71, including the
7	establishment of penalties for failure to comply or to make
8	reasonable efforts to maintain electric vehicle charging
9	stations in working order."
10	SECTION 6. Section 291-71, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	amended to read as follows:
12	"§291-71 Designation of parking spaces for electric
13	vehicles; charging system. (a) Places of public accommodation
14	with at least one hundred parking spaces available for use by
15	the general public shall have at least one parking space
16	exclusively for electric vehicles and equipped with an electric
17	vehicle charging system located anywhere in the parking
18	structure or lot by July 1, 2012; provided that no parking space
19	designated for electric vehicles shall displace or reduce
20	accessible stalls required by the Americans with Disabilities
21	Act Accessibility Guidelines. Spaces shall be designated,

- 1 clearly marked, and the exclusive designation enforced. Owners
- 2 of multiple parking facilities within the State may designate
- 3 and electrify fewer parking spaces than required in one or more
- 4 of their owned properties; provided that the scheduled
- 5 requirement is met for the total number of aggregate spaces on
- 6 all of their owned properties.
- 7 (b) Effective , each new electric vehicle
- 8 charging system installed or placed in service pursuant to this
- 9 section shall be at least a level 2 charging station that is
- 10 capable of connecting to the internet.
- 11 (c) Reasonable efforts shall be made to maintain electric
- 12 vehicle charging systems in working order.

- "Electric vehicle" means:
- 15 (1) A neighborhood electric vehicle as defined in section

- 17 (2) A vehicle, with four or more wheels, that draws
- 18 propulsion energy from a battery with at least four
- 19 kilowatt hours of energy storage capacity that can be
- 20 recharged from an external source of electricity; or
- 21 (3) A fuel cell electric vehicle.

- 1 SECTION 7. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

#### Report Title:

Electric Vehicle; Charging Stations; Parking Fee Exemption; Airports; Enforcement.

#### Description:

Limits electric vehicles' (EV) parking fee exemption to four hours. Excludes airports from the EV parking fee exemption. Extends sunset date of Act 168, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, until EVs are 10 percent of registered vehicles in the State. Requires certain places of public accommodation to make reasonable efforts to maintain EV charging stations in working order. Requires new EV charging systems installed pursuant to the EV charging system requirement to be at least Level 2 and network capable. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)
