- 7 the second degree if the person knowingly and persistently fails
- 8 to provide support which the person can provide and which the
- 9 person knows the person is legally obliged to provide to a
- 10 spouse, child, or other dependent.
- 11 (2) ["Support"] For the purposes of this section,
- 12 "support" includes but is not limited to food, shelter,
- 13 clothing, education, and other necessary care as determined by
- 14 law.
- 15 (3) Persistent nonsupport in the second degree is a

Persistent Nonsupport; Spouse; Child; Felony

Description:

Establishes the felony offense of persistent nonsupport in the first degree when a person knowingly and persistently fails to provide support to a child, spouse, or other dependent to whom the person has a legal obligation of support for five years or longer, or is \$30,000 or more in arrears.
