A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WATER SECURITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State is 2 especially vulnerable to the impact of climate change. 3 According to the 2014 report entitled "Climate Change Impacts in 4 Hawai'i: A summary of climate change and its impacts to Hawaii's 5 ecosystems and communities" by the University of Hawaii sea 6 grant college program, rainfall in the State declined over the 7 last thirty years while global sea levels rose over the last 8 century.

9 The legislature further finds that the State's fresh water 10 supply is threatened by the intrusion of saltwater and the 11 change in rainfall frequency and intensity. Both threats are 12 the result of climate change.

It is projected that sea levels will continue to rise at an accelerated rate. The 2014 University of Hawaii sea grant college program report projected "a 1-3 foot (approximately 0.3-1 meter) rise, or more, by the end of the century." Rising sea levels, coupled with the resulting coastal erosion, inundates

the land with saltwater and leads to contaminated fresh water
that is unable to recharge.

In addition, when precipitation decreases on islands, fresh water becomes less available as ground and surface water supplies are less likely to be recharged. The United States Environmental Protection Agency observed "a trend for decreasing precipitation" in the State and noted that "projections suggest a small decrease in precipitation during the wet season and a small increase during the dry season."

Lastly, the legislature finds that the state water code 10 11 under chapter 174C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires that the 12 commission on water resource management implement and use comprehensive water resources planning in its protection and 13 14 management of the State's water resources. The water code 15 requires updates to the Hawaii water plan to quide the 16 commission on water resource management in executing its general 17 powers, duties, and responsibilities in assuring economic 18 development, good municipal services, agricultural stability, 19 and environmental protection.

2	guide for	water resource protection and management, and consists	
3	of five major components:		
4	(1)	The water resource protection plan, which is prepared
