

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HOMELESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many homeless
- 2 persons thrive when they have ready access to familiar support
- 3 groups and loving family members. Many homeless persons from
- 4 the continental United States are currently stranded in Hawaii,
- 5 lacking independent financial resources to return to their home
- 6 states.
- 7 The legislature further finds that homelessness continues
- 8 to be one of the State's most significant and challenging social
- 9 problems. Hawaii has limited resources for human services, and
- 10 homeless persons may find their families or home states better
- 11 equipped to provide support.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to establish a return-to-home
- 13 program to assist the homeless with family reunification.
- 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 356D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 16 to read as follows:

2	§ 356	D- Return-to-home program. (a) There is
3	establish	ed within the authority a voluntary program to assist
4	eligible	homeless persons in reuniting with family members in
5	their hom	e states. The authority shall administer the program
6	and shall	adopt the standards and framework necessary to
7	implement	it.
8	(b)	No person shall be eligible to participate in the
9	program u	nless:
10	(1)	The person's participation is completely voluntary;
11	(2)	The person has a support system in place in the home
12		state that is willing to receive and accommodate them;
13	(3)	The person, if on parole, probation, or awaiting a
14		court hearing or sentencing, has proper clearance from
15		the court to participate in the program; and
16	(4)	The person is indigent and lacks the financial
17		resources to secure return transportation to the home
18		state.
19	(c)	The authority shall actively seek the participation of
20	local airlines, cruise lines, charter companies, homeless

- 1 programs, travel agencies, and the visitor industry to implement
- 2 and coordinate the program.
- 3 (d) The authority shall also assist program participants
- 4 with preparations for the return trip, including assisting them
- 5 in obtaining proper identification, orienting them to airport
- 6 security, and providing them with the basics of personal care.
- 7 (e) The authority shall follow up with all program
- 8 participants within one month of return to their home states to
- 9 support their reunification efforts."
- 10 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 11 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 12 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the
- 13 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 14 2020-2021 for implementing the return-to-home program, including
- 15 program costs and staff salaries.
- 16 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
- 17 public housing authority for the purposes of this Act.

1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2019.
