

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ZERO-EMISSION VEHICLES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that climate change
- 2 caused by greenhouse gas emissions from burning fossil fuels
- 3 poses a serious threat to the economic well-being, public
- 4 health, natural resources, and environment of Hawaii. The
- 5 potential adverse impacts of climate change include the
- 6 exacerbation of air-quality problems; a reduction in the quality
- 7 and supply of water; a rise in sea levels resulting in the
- 8 displacement of coastal businesses and residences; damage to
- 9 marine ecosystems and the natural environment; and an increase
- 10 in the incidences of infectious diseases, asthma, and other
- 11 human health-related problems.
- 12 The legislature further finds that the State has committed
- 13 to both eliminating imported fuels from the electricity and
- 14 ground transportation sectors and abiding by the 2015 Paris
- 15 Agreement's goal to limit the amount of global warming to less
- 16 than 1.5 degrees Celsius.

1	The legislature acknowledges that meeting the State's clear							
2	energy goals and commitments necessitates the rapid transition							
3	to vehicles that utilize local, renewable energy sources.							
4	The legislature further acknowledges that rental motor							
5	vehicles represent the largest passenger vehicle fleet in Hawai							
6	and are responsible for a significant amount of carbon							
7	emissions.							
8	The legislature finds that incorporating large numbers of							
9	zero-emission vehicles into rental motor vehicle fleets will:							
10	significantly reduce carbon emissions; increase the number of							
11	zero-emission vehicles entering the secondary market, making							
12	them more affordable to more Hawaii residents; and demonstrate							
13	to all who visit the State that Hawaii is a leader in clean							
14	energy and sustainable transportation.							
15	The purpose of this Act is to:							
16	(1) Require rental motor vehicle lessors operating in							
17	Hawaii to expedite the incorporation of zero-emission							
18	vehicles into their fleets;							
19	(2) Create a rental motor vehicle emissions surcharge tax							
20	on rental motor vehicles with internal combustion							
21	engines; and							

1	(3) Create a Hawaii zero-emission vehicle infrastructure
2	special fund and a grant program that utilizes the
3	proceeds from the rental motor vehicle emissions
4	surcharge tax to promote the development of the
5	refueling infrastructure necessary to enable the
6	large-scale adoption of zero-emission vehicles.
7	SECTION 2. Chapter 251, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
9	and to read as follows:
10	"§251- Rental motor vehicle emissions surcharge tax;
11	established. (a) Beginning on January 1, 2020, there is levied
12	and shall be assessed and collected each month a rental motor
13	vehicle emissions surcharge tax of \$1 for each day, or portion
14	of a day, that a rental motor vehicle is rented or leased. The
15	surcharge tax shall be levied upon the lessor.
16	(b) The rental motor vehicle emissions surcharge tax shall
17	not be levied on:
18	(1) Any motor vehicles qualifying in full or part as zero-
19	emission vehicles pursuant to section 437D-A; and
20	(2) Rental motor vehicles rented out as car-sharing
21	vehicles pursuant to section 251-2.5."

1 SECTION 3. Chapter 437D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately 3 designated and to read as follows: 4 "§437D-A Zero-emission vehicles. (a) All lessors of 5 rental motor vehicles in the State shall incorporate zero-6 emission light duty passenger vehicles into their rental motor 7 vehicle fleets according to the following schedule: 8 No less than ten per cent by July 1, 2022; (1) 9 No less than twenty-five per cent by July 1, 2024; and (2) 10 No less than fifty per cent by July 1, 2026. (3) 11 To certify compliance with this section, beginning in (b) 12 2022, each rental motor vehicle lessor in the State shall 13 prepare and deliver a report to the director annually by 14 December 1 that includes the make, model, license plate number, 15 and fuel type of each rental motor vehicle in the lessor's 16 fleet. (c) Lessors with fewer than the required number of zero-**17** 18 emission vehicles in their rental motor vehicle fleet as set 19 forth in subsection (a) shall pay a fine of \$1,000 per month for 20 each vehicle below the required amount.

1	(d) The requirements set forth in this section shall apply							
2	only to lessors owning and operating more than two hundred light							
3	duty passenger vehicles as rental motor vehicles statewide.							
4	(e) For the purposes of this section:							
5	"Battery electric vehicle" means a vehicle with four or							
6	more wheels that draws propulsion exclusively from a battery							
7	that can be recharged from an external source of energy.							
8	"Hydrogen fuel cell vehicle" means a vehicle with four or							
9

11	"Light duty passenger vehicle" means a vehicle below eight							
12	thousand five hundred pounds gross weight.							
13	"Plug-in hybrid electric vehicle" means a vehicle with four							
14								
15	also has an internal combustion engine that may be used to							
16								
17								
18	"Rental motor vehicle" has the same meaning as defined in							
19	section 251-1.							

1	"Zero-emission vehicle" means a battery electric vehicle, a						
2	plug-in hybrid electric vehicle, or a hydrogen fuel cell						
3	vehicle; provided that:						
4	(1) A plug-in hybrid electric vehicle with sixteen or more						
5	kilowatt hours of battery storage qualifies as a full						
6	zero-emission vehicle; and						
7	(2) A plug-in hybrid electric vehicle with less than						
8	sixteen kilowatt hours of battery storage qualifies as						
9	a partial zero-emission vehicle.						
10	The number of kilowatt hours of battery storage is to be						
11	calculated by dividing the total kilowatt hours of energy						
12	storage in the battery by sixteen, rounded to the nearest tenth.						
13	§437D-B Hawaii zero-emission vehicle infrastructure						
14	special fund; grant program; established. (a) There is						
15	established the Hawaii zero-emission vehicle infrastructure						
16	special fund to be administered by the department of						
17	transportation. All moneys received from any surcharge taxes						
18	assessed pursuant to section 251- or any fines imposed under						
19	section 437D-A shall be deposited into the special fund and						
20	shall be used to develop, administer, and market the Hawaii						
21	zero-emission vehicle infrastructure grant program.

5	and to facilitate and demonstrate financially sustainable

7	(c) Any public agency or private organization shall be						
8	eligible to apply to the department of transportation for use of						
9	grant program funds on a competitive basis; provided that the						
10	department shall give priority to proposals that facilitate the						
11	large-scale integration of zero-emission vehicles into rental						
12	motor vehicle fleets.						
13	(d) All costs related to the development of zero-emission						

There is established in the department of

- vehicle fueling infrastructure are eligible for funding,

 including planning, engineering, construction, and the purchase

 and installation of equipment; provided that costs associated

 with ongoing operations of fueling infrastructure shall not be

 eligible.
- (e) Any recipient of funding shall be required to match atleast twenty per cent of the grant program moneys received.

Report Title:

Zero-Emission Vehicles; Rental Cars; Inventory; Fleet

Description:

Requires rental motor vehicle lessors to incorporate zeroemission vehicles into their fleets. Creates a rental motor vehicle emissions surcharge tax on rental motor vehicles with internal combustion engines. Creates a Hawaii zero-emissions vehicle infrastructure special fund and grant program to promote development of zero-emission vehicle infrastructure.

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
