A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE COMMUNITY-BASED ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 210D-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "S210D-4 Hawaii community-based economic development
- 4 revolving fund; established. (a) There is established a
- 5 revolving fund to be known as the Hawaii community-based
- 6 economic development revolving fund from which moneys shall be
- 7 loaned or granted by the department under this chapter. [All]
- 8 (b) Except as provided by subsection (c), all moneys
- 9 appropriated to the fund by the legislature, received as
- 10 repayments of loans, payments of interest or fees, and all other
- 11 moneys received by the fund from any other source shall be
- 12 deposited into the revolving fund and used for the purposes of
- 13 this chapter. The department may deposit moneys it receives
- 14 from the repayments of loans and payments of interest or fees
- 15 from the Hawaii capital loan program established by chapter 210,
- 16 the Hawaii large fishing vessel purchase, construction,
- 17 renovation, maintenance, and repair loan program established by

1	part II of chapter 189, and the Hawaii small fishing vessel loan		
2	program established by part IV of chapter 189, into the Hawaii		
3	community-based economic development revolving fund to be used		
4	for the purposes of this chapter. The department may use all		
5	appropriations and other moneys in the revolving fund not		
6	appropriated for a designated purpose to make grants or loans.		
7	(c) A separate subaccount of the Hawaii community-based		
8	economic development revolving fund, to be known as the micro		
9	enterprise assistance program on Hawaiian home lands subaccount,		
10	shall be established. All moneys in the subaccount shall:		
11	(1) Be used exclusively for the purposes of providing		
12	grants or loans for qualified native Hawaiians as		
13	defined by the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act of 1920		
14	and pursuant to article XII of the state constitution		
15	through implementation of the micro enterprise		
16	assistance program. Entities qualified to receive		
17	funding pursuant to this subsection are:		
18	(A) Native Hawaiian-controlled homestead associations		
19	with members who are qualified native Hawaiians		
20	as defined by the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act		

1		of 1920 and pursuant to article XII of the state
2		constitution;
3	<u>(B)</u>	A Hawaiian homestead association's designated tax
4		exempt community development corporation; or
5	(C)	Native Hawaiian community organizations with a
6		demonstrated ability and history of making and
7		administering loans and providing support to
8		qualified native Hawaiians as defined by the
9		Hawaiian Homes Commission Act of 1920; and
10	(2) Cons	ist of the following:
11	(A)	Revenues, income, and receipts derived from the
12		Hawaiian home lands development program;
13	(B)	Appropriations from the legislature;
14	<u>(C)</u>	Federal grants and subsidies to the State;
15	<u>(D)</u>	Private investments; or
16	<u>(E)</u>	Voluntary contributions."
17	SECTION 2	. There is appropriated out of the general
18	revenues of th	e State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
