A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

PART I

2 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that not only is climate change real, but it is also the overriding challenge of the 3 4 twenty-first century. The legislature notes that one of the 5 priority issues of the State is mitigating climate change, and that the State is committed to having a one hundred per cent 6 7 renewable energy portfolio by 2045. Further, in enacting Act 32, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017, the legislature recognized that 8 9 climate change poses a serious threat to the State's economic 10 well-being, public health, and natural resources. Through Act 15, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018, the legislature established the 11 12 State's zero emissions clean economy target to sequester more atmospheric carbon and greenhouse gases than emitted within the 13 14 State as quickly as practicable, but no later than 2045.

In Act 16, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018, the legislature stated that it is in the public interest to create a carbon offset program in the State that would incentivize and reward

1 the adoption of, practice of, and adherence to carbon emission 2 reduction activities. Act 16 established the carbon offset program to incentivize state agencies, private entities, and 3 4 individuals to adopt practices that are more environmentally friendly and that result in reduced carbon emissions into the 5 6 environment. Act 16 also authorized the investment of revenues realized from the sale of carbon offset credits under the 7 8 program into projects to generate further carbon offset credits 9 or enhance the State's efforts to mitigate and adapt to climate 10 change.

11 The legislature believes that it is appropriate to take the12 next steps toward environmentally-sound policies.

13 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:

14 (1) Expand the scope of the carbon offset program;

15 (2) Establish a carbon offset revolving fund to assist in
16 the fulfillment of the purposes of the carbon offset
17 program; and

18 (3) Appropriate funds necessary for the carbon offset19 program.

8		agencies from sales of carbon credits other than as
9		described in paragraph (2) to be invested in projects
10		enhancing the State's efforts to mitigate or adapt to

13	(5)	Certifies project types and specific projects;
14	(6)	Coordinates with investors;
15	(7)	Uses the services of third-party auditors to verify
16		project performance and ensure environmental

19		under section 225P-A; and

1 The office of planning in partnership with the (b) 2 greenhouse gas sequestration task force shall submit a report of 3 its findings and recommendations, including any proposed 4 legislation, to the legislature and the climate change 5 mitigation and adaptation commission no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2020. 6 7 (c) All state agencies shall participate in the carbon 8 offset program. 9 (d) The governor, the president of the senate and the 10 speaker of the house of representatives, the chief justice, and 11 the chairperson of the office of Hawaiian affairs shall each 12 implement a program in their respective branches of state 13 government to require all agencies to participate in the carbon 14 offset program to offset carbon emissions caused by air travel 15 undertaken by an employee of the agency in performance of the 16 employee's official duties. The cost of the offset shall be 17 paid to the office of planning by each agency for its respective employees on a per trip basis at a rate, which may include 18 19 reasonable costs for administering the program, determined by 20 the office.

"Carbon credit" means a tradable certificate or permit
 issued by a carbon registry that represents a greenhouse gas
 reduction or greenhouse gas removal enhancement that is
 equivalent to one metric ton of carbon dioxide and meets the
 requirements of the carbon offset program.

6 "Carbon offset" means a compensatory measure made by an
7 agency, business, or individual to reduce carbon dioxide
8 emissions or to increase carbon dioxide sequestration.

9 "Carbon registry" means any established international, 10 national, or regional carbon registry program that serves 11 voluntary or compliance markets, provides an independent carbon 12 standard to verify and certify carbon offsets, and issues carbon 13 credits."

15 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 16 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the 17 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 18 19 2020-2021 to be deposited into the carbon offset revolving fund. 20 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the carbon offset revolving fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be 21
