A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that postgraduate medical 2 students, such as resident and fellow physicians, are required 3 by their training programs' national accrediting body and their specialty boards to actively learn about and participate in 4 5 health care quality improvement activities in close alignment 6 with the health care entities that provide the clinical learning environment for these trainee physicians. One of the core 7 8 competencies that all physicians are expected to attain by the 9 end of residency training is to continuously improve patient 10 care based on constant self-evaluation and life-long learning. 11 Resident and fellow physicians are expected to incorporate 12 formative evaluation feedback, such as peer review as defined in 13 chapter 671D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, in their daily practice. They are also expected to participate in identifying system 14 15 errors and implementing potential systems solutions, which mirrors the intent of chapter 671D, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 16

1 The legislature finds that although postgraduate medical students practicing as resident or fellow physicians are 2 3 currently subject to being named in lawsuits, they are unable to 4 participate in and attain the protections granted by peer-review 5 processes intended to improve the quality of medical care 6 delivery. Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to encourage 7 postgraduate medical student physicians to participate in peerreview processes by affording them the same incentives and 8 9 protections as licensed physicians engaging in effective peer 10 review. 11 SECTION 2. Section 671D-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending the definition of "physician" to read as **12** 13 follows: 14 "Physician" means an individual licensed under chapter 453 15 or section 463E-1, to practice medicine or surgery or osteopathy 16 or podiatric medicine[+], including those physicians participating in nationally-recognized accredited graduate **17** medical training programs that are sited at a health care entity 18 19 as defined in this chapter; an individual licensed under chapter 20 448 to practice dentistry or dental surgery; or any individual 21 who, without authority, holds oneself out to be so authorized."

- 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
