

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FORMER PRESIDENT BARACK OBAMA.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. (a) There is established a temporary
2	commission to develop and implement initiatives recognizing and
3	honoring former President Barack Obama, his historic legacy, and
4	his impact on the State, to be placed within the department of
5	business, economic development, and tourism for administrative
6	purposes.
7	(b) The temporary commission shall be composed of the
8	following members:
9	(1) The governor or the governor's designee;
10	(2) The president of the senate or the president's
11	designee;
12	(3) The speaker of the house of representatives or the
13	speaker's designee;
14	(4) The director of business, economic development, and
15	tourism or the director's designee;

1	(5)	The president and chief executive officer of the							
2		Hawaii tourism authority or the president and chief							
3		executive officer's designee;							
4	(6)	The chief executive officer of the office of Hawaiian							
5		affairs or the chief executive officer's designee;							
6	(7)	The president of the University of Hawaii or the							
7		president's designee;							
8	(8)	The mayor of the city and county of Honolulu or the							
9		mayor's designee; and							
10	(9) A member of the community preferably with expe								
11	knowledge on former President Barack Obama to b								
12		appointed by the governor.							
13	(c)	The temporary commission shall select one of its							
14	members to serve as chairperson.								
15	(d) The members of the temporary commission shall serve								
16	without compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses,								
17	including	travel expenses, necessary for the performance of							
18	their duties.								
19	(e)	The temporary commission:							
20	(1)	Shall serve as the planning agency for all state-							
21		sponsored events and the coordinating agency for all							

1		state-sponsored and other events for the purpose of					
2		honoring former President Barack Obama;					
3	(2)	Shall solicit funding from private and public sources					
4		for the purposes of paragraph (1);					
5	(3)	May accept appropriations from the State, counties,					
6		foreign governments, intergovernmental agencies, and					
7		non-governmental agencies for the purposes of					
8		<pre>paragraph (1);</pre>					
9	(4)	May accept donations of money and personal property					
10		from private and public sources; provided that all					
11		such donations are recorded and appropriately					
12		accounted for; and					
13	(5)	Shall submit a report of its activities and proposed					
14		activities, plans, and recommendations, including any					
15		proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than					
16		twenty days prior to the convening of the regular					
17		session of 2020.					
18	(f)	No member shall be made subject to chapter 84, Hawaii					
19	Revised S	tatutes, solely because of that member's participation					
20	as a member of the commission.

- 4 (h) The commission shall cease to exist on June 30, 2021.
- 5 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the
- 8 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 9 2020-2021 to support the temporary commission established
- 10 pursuant to this Act.
- 11 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 12 of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes
- 13 of this Act.

14 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2019.
