A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that the intersection SECTION 1. 2 between opioid and other substance abuse, mental health, and 3 homelessness is inarguable, and that the State's overall mental 4 health system of care needs to improve. Effective integration 5 of the behavioral health system is essential to ensuring that 6 individuals experiencing chronic substance abuse, mental health 7 conditions, homelessness, and other chronic conditions are 8 afforded a continuum of care that promotes community 9 stabilization and health while decreasing overutilization of 10 high cost acute care services.

11 The legislature also finds that coordinated entry systems 12 have been successful in several counties and states on the 13 mainland in ensuring that access to behavioral health and 14 substance abuse services are more readily available and more 15 effectively coordinated. Therefore, the legislature concludes 16 that coordinated entry systems and coordinated policy frameworks 17 for evaluation and implementation of behavioral health and



integrated health systems are necessary to effectively decrease
 and address the negative impacts of substance abuse, mental
 health conditions, and homelessness.

The purpose of this Act is to establish a working group to evaluate current system gaps and determine steps that may be taken by the State to promote effective integration of behavioral health care and related systems to address the negative impacts of substance abuse, mental health conditions, and homelessness.

10 SECTION 2. (a) There is established within the department 11 of health a working group to evaluate current behavioral health 12 care and related systems and identify steps that may be taken to 13 promote effective integration to more effectively respond to, 14 and coordinate care for, persons experiencing substance abuse, 15 mental health conditions, and homelessness.

16 (b) The working group shall consist of the following 17 members:

18 (1) The director of health, or the director's designee,
19 who shall serve as chair;

20 (2) One representative of the department of health
21 behavioral health services administration;

(4)	One representative of the department of human services

(5)	One representative of the judiciary;
(6)	One or more representatives of the Hawaii Opioid

thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the
 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
 2020-2021 for the purposes of this Act.

4 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department5 of health for the purposes of this Act.

6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
