RELATING TO CRIMINAL TRESPASS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 708-814.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "[+]\$708-814.7[+] Criminal trespass onto state lands. (1) 4 Except for lands owned by the office of Hawaiian affairs, and 5 except for improved state lands that are designated safe havens 6 by state departments or agencies [-7] or that are under executive 7 order by the governor to be used as a safe haven and have a 8 department of health component and adequate space, not to 9 include state hospitals, a person commits the offense of 10 criminal trespass onto state lands if:

11 (a) The person enters or remains unlawfully in or upon any12 improved state land when:

(i) The land is closed to public use and its closure
hours are posted on a sign or signs on the
improved state land[7] and, after a request to
leave is made by any law enforcement officer, the
person remains in or upon the land; or

The land is not open to the public and there are 1 (ii) signs that are sufficient to give reasonable 2 notice that read: "Government Property - No 3 Trespassing"; provided that these signs shall 4 contain letters no less than two inches in height 5 and shall be placed at reasonable intervals no 6 less than three signs to a mile along the 7 boundary line of the land and at all roads and 8 trails entering the land in a manner and position 9 as to be clearly noticeable from outside the 10 11 boundary; or

The person enters or remains unlawfully in or upon any 12 (b) state land on or under any highway [-7] and the state 13 land has a sign or signs displayed upon the land that 14 are sufficient to give reasonable notice that read: 15 "Government Property - No Trespassing"; provided that 16 the signs shall contain letters no less than two 17 inches in height and shall be placed at reasonable 18 intervals no less than three signs to a mile along the 19 boundary line of the land and at all roads and trails 20

entering the land in a manner and position as to be
 clearly noticeable from outside the boundary.
 (2) Criminal trespass onto state lands is a petty
 misdemeanor.

5 (3) For the purposes of this section, unless the context6 requires otherwise:

7 "Highway" has the same meaning as in section 286-2.

"Improved state land" means any state land, including but 8 9 not limited to harbors under the care and control of the department of transportation under chapter 266[-7] and small boat 10 11 harbors under the care and control of the department of land and 12 natural resources under chapter 200, upon which there is 13 improvement, including any structure, building, or facility; or 14 alteration of the land by grading, dredging, or mining that 15 would cause a permanent change in the land or that would change 16 the basic natural condition of the land. Land is not "improved 17 state land" if it only has minor improvements, including utility 18 poles, signage, and irrigation facilities or systems; or minor 19 alterations undertaken for the preservation or prudent 20 management of the unimproved or unused land, including fences, 21 trails, or pathways. Land is not "improved state land" solely

due to the performance of state maintenance activities on the 1 land, including forest plantings and the removal of weeds, 2 brush, rocks, boulders, or trees; or removal or securing of 3 rocks or boulders undertaken to reduce risk to downslope 4 5 properties. 6 "State lands" means all land owned by the State through any 7 of its departments or agencies. (4) No conviction under this section shall be used to 8 9 establish a felony conviction under section 708-803. 10 (5) Except as otherwise provided by law, any county police 11 department that receives a request from an applicable state department or agency to remove a person who has unlawfully 12 entered onto and remained in or upon any state lands in 13 14 violation of this section shall respond to the request and, if 15 possible, remove the alleged violator from the state lands." 16 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 18 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 19
