A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE COMMUNITY-BASED ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ADVISORY COUNCIL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that private for-profit
 start-up agricultural businesses encounter many impediments in
 acquiring financial assistance for infrastructure including
 fences, water delivery systems, access roads, equipment, and
 agriculture buildings.

The legislature further finds that the community-based 6 economic development advisory council, within the department of 7 business, economic development, and tourism, is best suited to 8 evaluate the available means and barriers to obtain loans and 9 grants to fund infrastructure projects for private for-profit 10 start-up agricultural businesses. The department of business, 11 economic development, and tourism works with federal agencies, 12 counties, and other state agencies to assist in the development 13 of agriculture in Hawaii. 14

According to the 2018 Community-Based Economic Development
Program Annual Report, the community business economic



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development revolving fund program continued its partnership 1 2 with the department of agriculture's micro-loan fund program. 3 In addition, in fiscal year 2018, the community-based economic development technical and financial assistance program provided 4 business training and informational workshops that assisted many 5 community-based organizations, cooperatives, and small 6 7 businesses, including the co-sponsorship of the annual Hawaii small business fair, sponsorship of the native Hawaiian small 8 9 business resources fair held in conjunction with the council for 10 native Hawaiian advancement's annual convention, and other 11 outreach initiatives on all the major islands.

12 The legislature further finds that because start-ups are 13 not established businesses with a financial track record, access 14 to funds for infrastructure projects poses a major impediment to 15 their development and economic growth.

16 The legislature further finds that it is time to evaluate 17 how the State of Hawaii can assist private for-profit start-up 18 agricultural businesses in funding their infrastructure 19 projects.

20 The purpose of this Act is to direct the community-based21 economic development advisory council to evaluate the available



means and barriers to accessing funding sources by private for-1 profit start-up agricultural businesses to finance their 2 3 infrastructure projects. SECTION 2. (a) The community-based economic development 4 5 advisory council shall retain professional research and analysis 6 services to evaluate the means and barriers to accessing funding 7 sources by private for-profit start-up agricultural businesses to finance their infrastructure projects. The council shall 8 9 have oversight over the evaluation process. 10 (b) The evaluation shall include: 11 An analysis by the community-based economic (1) development advisory council of the definitions of 12 13 "small business" in Hawaii according to the federal Small Business Administration, Hawaii Revised 14 15 Statutes, and county ordinances, and the impact of these definitions, if any, on the acquisition of funds 16 17 for infrastructure projects; An analysis of the current requirements and 18 (2) 19 qualifications, and their impact, for loans and grants 20 to private for-profit start-up agricultural businesses 21 for the purpose of financing infrastructure projects;

17			requirements to determine whether a taxpayer

20		avai	lable funds, such as urban farming versus rural
21		farm	ing. The research shall also include an

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1		assessment of the effectiveness and relevancy of			
2		specifying agricultural competence as a condition to			
3		qualify for infrastructure financing;			
4	(5)	Critical policy language that recognizes and			
5		acknowledges the situation encountered by private for-			
6		profit start-up agricultural businesses in financing			
7		infrastructure projects; and			
8	(6)	Any other matters relevant to the purposes of this			
9		Act.			
10	(c)	For purposes of this Act, "infrastructure" means			
11	agriculturally related fences, water delivery systems, access				
12	roads, equipment, and buildings. "Infrastructure" shall not				
13	include housing or the purchasing or leasing of land.				
14	SECTION 3. The community-based economic development				
15	advisory council shall report its findings and recommendations,				
16	including any proposed legislation, based on the evaluation				
17	conducted by the professional research and analysis services				
18	retained by the council, to the legislature. A preliminary				
· 19	report on the progress of the evaluation shall be submitted to				
20	the legislature no later than thirty days prior to the convening				

1	of the regular session of 2020 and a final report shall be
2	submitted by June 30, 2020.
3	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
4	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
5	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 for
6	professional research and analysis services to perform the
7	evaluation pursuant to section 2 of this Act.
8	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
9	business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
10	this Act.

11 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2150.
