

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many of the inmates
- 2 at the State's overcrowded prisons have violated probation,
- 3 parole, or furlough by use of illicit substances and are in need
- 4 of substance abuse treatment and mental health services.
- 5 The legislature further finds that the department of public
- 6 safety is statutorily required pursuant to section 353-10.5,
- 7 Hawaii Revised Statutes, to implement alternative programs that
- 8 place, control, supervise, and treat selected offenders in lieu
- 9 of incarceration.
- 10 The legislature further finds that the department of public
- 11 safety has available space at Halawa valley for the new Oahu
- 12 community correctional center to also accommodate a minimum-
- 13 security facility to house up to four hundred fifty short-term
- 14 adult offenders. The purpose of the minimum-security facility
- 15 shall be to alleviate the overcrowded conditions of the State's
- 16 prison system and to provide much-needed substance abuse
- 17 treatment and support services, cognitive behavioral

- 1 intervention, and transitional programming instead of returning
- 2 an offender to a "hard bed" in a correctional institution.
- Furthermore, it has been determined that the offenders
- 4 housed at this minimum-security facility shall have violated
- 5 probation, parole, or furlough by illicit substance use, or are
- 6 sentenced felon probationers, or sentenced misdemeanants
- 7 identified as high risk for illicit substance use or recidivism.
- 8 The minimum-security facility shall also have the capacity
- 9 to house adult males in a furlough program in a minimum-security
- 10 setting.
- 11 The legislature further finds that the department of health
- 12 is statutorily required pursuant to section 26-13, Hawaii
- 13 Revised Statutes, to administer programs designed to protect,
- 14 preserve, care for, and improve the physical and mental health
- 15 of the people of the State. The legislature finds that the
- 16 department of health has access to the best personnel to provide
- 17 substance abuse treatment and support services, cognitive
- 18 behavioral intervention, and transitional programming in lieu of
- 19 incarceration.
- 20 The purpose of this Act is to establish within the
- 21 department of public safety with assistance from the department

- 1 of health a minimum-security housing program for short-term
- 2 adult offenders in a county with a population of more than seven
- 3 hundred fifty thousand.
- 4 SECTION 2. Chapter 353, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 6 and to read as follows:
- 7 "§353- Minimum-security housing program; short-term
- 8 adult offenders. (a) There is established within the
- 9 department of public safety a minimum-security housing program
- 10 for short-term adult offenders in a county with a population of
- 11 more than seven hundred fifty thousand. The minimum-security
- 12 housing program shall be located at or near a community
- 13 correctional center and a prison.
- 14 (b) The purpose of the minimum-security housing program is
- 15 to alleviate the overcrowded conditions of the State's prison
- 16 system and have the department of health provide assistance in
- 17 substance abuse treatment and support services, cognitive
- 18 behavioral intervention, and transitional programming in lieu of
- 19 incarceration.
- 20 (c) The offenders housed at the minimum-security housing
- 21 program shall be:

1	(1)	Probation or parole violators;
2	(2)	Illicit substance abuse furlough violators;
3	(3)	Sentenced felon probationers; or
4	(4)	Sentenced misdemeanants identified as high risk for
5		illicit substance use or recidivism;
6	(d)	The minimum-security housing program shall also have
7	the capacity to house adult males in a furlough program in a	
8 12	minimum-s	ecurity setting."
9	SECT	TION 3. The director of finance is authorized to issue
10	general obligation bonds in the sum of \$ or so much	
11	thereof a	s may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof
12	as may be	necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2019-2020
13	for the p	ourpose of a minimum-security housing program. The sums
14	appropria	ted shall be allocated as follows:
15	(1)	\$ for the design of the four hundred fifty-bed
16		minimum-security housing facility; and
17	(2)	\$ for the construction of the four hundred
18		fifty-bed minimum-security housing facility.
19	SECT	CION 4. The appropriation made for the capital
20	improvement project authorized by this Act shall not lapse at	
21	the end o	of the fiscal biennium for which the appropriation is

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1 made; provided that all moneys from the appropriation unencumbered as of June 30, 2022, shall lapse as of that date. 2 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general 3 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 4 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the 5 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 6 2020-2021 for the minimum-security housing program. The sums 7 appropriated shall be allocated as follows: 8 for the hiring of staff to oversee the 9 (1) minimum-security facility; and 10 11 (2) for the operation of the minimum-security 12 housing program. The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department **13** of public safety for the purposes of this Act. 14 15 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the **17** 18 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 19 2020-2021 for the hiring of staff and the procurement of substance abuse treatment services, cognitive behavioral 20

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- 1 intervention, and transitional programming within the department
- 2 of health for the minimum-security housing program.
- 3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 4 of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 7. This Act shall be liberally construed to
- 6 accomplish the purposes set forth in section 1 of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 8. All laws and parts of laws heretofore enacted
- 8 that are in conflict with the provisions of this Act are hereby
- 9 amended to conform herewith.
- 10 SECTION 9. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2019.
