

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMELAND SECURITY.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 128A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	" <b>§128A- Hawaii state fusion center.</b> (a) There is
5	established in the office of homeland security a state fusion
6	center that shall be known as the Hawaii state fusion center.
7	The director of homeland security, subject to the direction and
8	control of the governor, shall oversee the Hawaii state fusion
9	center.
10	(b) There shall be a Hawaii state fusion center director
11	who shall be appointed, and may be removed, by the director of
12	homeland security. The director of the Hawaii state fusion
13	center shall be responsible for the day-to-day operations of the
14	Hawaii state fusion center. The director of the Hawaii state
15	fusion center shall not be subject to chapter 76, and the
16	position shall be funded by the State.
17	(c) The Hawaii state fusion center shall:

13			awareness related to critical infrastructure or
14			key resources protection of lifelines;
15		<u>(B)</u>	Coordinate with local, state, and federal
16			agencies for asset response activities to
17			include:
18			(i) Furnishing technical assistance to affected
19			entities to protect their assets, mitigate
20			vulnerabilities, and reduce impacts of cyber
21			incidents;



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1	<u>(ii)</u>	Identifying other entities that may be at
2		risk and assessing their risk to the same or
3		similar vulnerabilities;
4	<u>(iii)</u>	Assessing potential risks to the State or
5		region, including potential cascading
6		effects, and developing courses of action to
7		mitigate these risks;
8	<u>(iv</u> )	Facilitating information sharing and
9	(B)	operational coordination to respond to
10		threats; and
11	<u>(v)</u>	Providing guidance as to how best to utilize
12		federal resources and capabilities in a
13		timely, effective manner to speed recovery;
14		and
15	(C) Prov	vide intelligence support and related
16	acti	vities, facilitate the building of
17	situ	ational threat awareness and sharing of
18	rela	ated intelligence, including the integrated
19	anal	lysis of threat trends and events, the
20	ider	ntification of knowledge gaps, and the ability
