A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION REGARDING THE ELECTION OF STATE OFFICIALS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to propose

amendments to article III, section 4 and article V, sections 1

and 2 of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii to:

- (1) Provide that if there are two or more candidates for a seat in the state senate, for a seat in the state house of representatives, for governor, or for lieutenant governor, and if:
 - (A) Any candidate receives a majority of the votes cast for that public office in a primary election, that candidate shall be declared elected to that public office; or
 - (B) No candidate receives a majority of the votes cast for that public office in the primary election, the two candidates who received the highest number of votes shall advance to a general election, in which the candidate

2	that public office shall be elected to that
3	public office; and
4	(2) Repeal current constitutional language that requires
5	that the:
6	(A) Lieutenant governor be elected at the same time
7	as the governor; and
8	(B) Votes cast in a general election for a nominee of
9	governor shall be deemed cast for the nominee for
10	lieutenant governor of the same political party.
11	SECTION 2. Article III, section 4, of the Constitution of
12	the State of Hawaii is amended to read as follows:
13	"ELECTION OF MEMBERS; TERM
14	Section 4. Each member of the legislature shall be elected
15	at an election. If [more than one candidate has been nominated]
16	there are two or more candidates for election to a seat in the
17	legislature, [the member occupying that seat] there shall be
18	[elected at] a [general] primary election[-] for that seat, and
19	<u>if:</u>

1	(1)	Any candidate receives a majority of the votes cast				
2		for that seat in the primary election, that candidate				
3		shall be declared elected to that seat; or				
4	(2)	No candidate receives a majority of the votes cast for				
5		that seat in the primary election, the two candidates				
6		who received the highest number of votes shall advance				
7		to a general election, in which the candidate				
8		receiving the highest number of votes cast for that				
9		seat shall be elected to that seat.				
10	If a	candidate [nominated] for a seat [at a primary				
11	election]	is unopposed for that seat [at the general election],				
12	the candid	date shall be deemed elected at the primary election.				
13	The term	of office of a member of the house of representatives				
14	shall be	two years and the term of office of a member of the				
15	senate shall be four years. The term of a member of the					
16	legislature shall begin on the day of the general election at					
17	which elected or if elected at a primary election, on the day o					
18	the genera	al election immediately following the primary election				
19	at which	elected. For a member of the house of representatives,				
20	the term shall end on the day of the general election					
21	immediate	ly following the day the member's term commences. For				

1	a member of the senate, the term shall end on the day of the				
2	second general election immediately following the day the				
3	member's term commences."				
4	SECTION 3. Article V, section 1, of the Constitution of				
5	the State of Hawaii is amended to read as follows:				
6	"ESTABLISHMENT OF THE EXECUTIVE				
7	Section 1. The executive power of the State shall be				
8	vested in a governor. The governor shall be elected by the				
9	qualified voters of this State (at a general election. The				
10	person receiving the highest number of votes shall be the]. If				
11	there are two are more candidates for governor[-], there shall				
12	be a primary election for the office of the governor, and if:				
13	(1) Any candidate receives a majority of the votes cast				
14	for the office of the governor in the primary				
15	election, that candidate shall be declared elected as				
16	governor; or				
17	(2) No candidate receives a majority of the votes cast for				
18	the office of the governor in the primary election,				
19	the two candidates who received the highest number of				
20	votes shall advance to a general election, in which				
21	the candidate receiving the highest number of votes				

1	cast for the office of the governor shall be elected			
2	governor.			
3	In case of a tie vote, the selection of the governor shal			
4	be determined as provided by law.			
5	The term of office of the governor shall begin at noon on			
6	the first Monday in December next following the governor's			
7	election and end at noon on the first Monday in December, four			
8	years thereafter.			
9	No person shall be elected to the office of governor for			
10	more than two consecutive full terms.			
11	No person shall be eligible for the office of governor			
12	unless the person shall be a qualified voter, have attained the			
13	age of thirty years and have been a resident of this State for			
14	five years immediately preceding the person's election.			
15	The governor shall not hold any other office or employment			
16	of profit under the State or the United States during the			
17	governor's term of office."			
18	SECTION 4. Article V, section 2, of the Constitution of			

the State of Hawaii is amended to read as follows:

1	"LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR					
2	Section 2. There shall be a lieutenant governor who shall					
3	have the same qualifications as the governor. The lieutenant					
4	governor shall be elected [at the same time,] for the same term					
5	and in the same manner as the governor[; provided that the vote					
6	cast in the general election for the nominee for governor shall					
7	be deemed cast for the nominee for lieutenant governor of the					
8	same political party]. No person shall be elected to the office					
9	of lieutenant governor for more than two consecutive full terms					
10	The lieutenant governor shall perform such duties as may be					
11	provided by law."					
12	SECTION 5. The question to be printed on the ballot shall					
13	be as follows:					
14	"Shall constitutional provisions relating to the election					
15	of state officials be amended to:					
16	(1) Provide that if there are two or more candidates for a					
17	seat in the state senate, for a seat in the state					
18	house of representatives, for governor, or for					
19	lieutenant governor, and if:					
20	(A) Any candidate receives a majority of the votes					
21	cast for that public office in a primary					

1			election, that candidate shall be declared
2			elected to that public office; or
3		(B)	No candidate receives a majority of the votes
4			cast for that public office in the primary
5			election, the two candidates who received the
6			highest number of votes shall advance to a
7			general election, in which the candidate

Description:

Provides that if there are 2 or more candidates for a state public office, and a candidate receives the majority of votes for that office in the primary election, that candidate shall be elected. Provides that if none of the candidates receives a majority of votes cast in a primary election for a state public office, the 2 candidates who receive the highest number of votes for that office shall advance to a general election. Repeals constitutional requirements that a candidate for lieutenant governor be elected at the same time and on the same party ticket as a candidate for governor.
