A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TOURISM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 237D-6.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

3 "(b) Except for the revenues collected pursuant to section

4 237D-2(e), revenues collected under this chapter shall be

5 distributed in the following priority, with the excess revenues

6 to be deposited into the general fund:

7 \$1,500,000 shall be allocated to the Turtle Bay (1)8 conservation easement special fund beginning July 1, 9 2015, for the reimbursement to the state general fund 10 of debt service on reimbursable general obligation 11 bonds, including ongoing expenses related to the 12 issuance of the bonds, the proceeds of which were used 13 to acquire the conservation easement and other real 14 property interests in Turtle Bay, Oahu, for the protection, preservation, and enhancement of natural 15 16 resources important to the State, until the bonds are 17 fully amortized;
