A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AUTOMATIC VOTER REGISTRATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§11- Applications for a driver's license or civil
5	identification card. (a) Notwithstanding any law to the
6	contrary, an affidavit on an application for voter registration
7	shall be a part of any application for the issuance of a
8	driver's license under section 286-109 or a civil identification
9	card under section 286-301.
10	(b) An application for a driver's license or civil
11	identification card shall not be processed until the applicant
12	has:
13	(1) Been confirmed electronically as a currently
14	registered voter;
15	(2) Applied on the application form to register to vote;
16	or

1	(3) Affirmatively declined on the application form to
2	register to vote.
3	(c) If an applicant for a driver's license or civil
4	identification card is a currently registered voter, an
5	application form shall serve to automatically update the
6	applicant's voter registration residence address, mailing
7	address, or name, as applicable. A notice to this effect shall
8	be stated on any application form utilized by the examiner of
9	drivers.
10	(d) The examiner of drivers and the state department of
11	transportation shall maintain current electronic database
12	records indicating each driver's license or civil identification
13	card holder's status as a registered voter, in addition to any
14	other information referred to in subsection (e).
15	(e) The examiner of drivers shall electronically transmit
16	to the office of elections, on a real time basis, information
17	required by this subsection for any applicant who is a currently
18	registered voter or any applicant who is a United States citizen
19	and has not affirmatively declined to register to vote. The
20	information required for electronic transmittal includes an

7	SECT	ION 2. Section 286-109, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended t	o read as follows:
9	" §28	6-109 General provision governing the issuance of
10	licenses.	(a) Upon payment of the required fee and upon
11	demonstra	ting the ability to operate a certain category or
12	categorie	s of motor vehicles to the satisfaction of the examiner
13	of driver	s, an applicant for a driver's license shall be issued
14	a single	license of a design approved by the director of
15	transport	ation upon which is made a notation of:
16	(1)	The category or categories of motor vehicles the
17		applicant may operate;
18	(2)	Any restrictive provisions to which the license is
19		subject;
20	(3)	Veteran status, if desired by the applicant; provided

that the notation shall be on the front of the license

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1		and shall not include any designation other than the
2		term "veteran"; and
3	(4)	When the license is issued to a person under twenty-
4		one years of age, a statement, in clearly legible
5		print that shall contrast with the other information
6		appearing on the license, which indicates the date on
7		which the person will attain the age of twenty-one
8		years.
9	As used in	n this subsection, "veteran" means any person who
10	served in	any of the uniformed services of the United States,
11	including	veterans of the Korean conflict and persons who served
12	in the arm	med forces of the Republic of Korea, who fought under
13	the commar	nd of the United Nations led by the United States,
14	during the	e Korean conflict and are currently United States
15	citizens,	and was discharged under conditions other than
16	dishonorab	ole.
17	(b)	The examiner of drivers shall not issue or renew any
18	driver's	license using the driver's social security number on
19	the drive	r's license.

(c) Statutes of limitations and other provisions of this

chapter notwithstanding, no driver's license or instruction



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1 permit shall be issued or renewed under this section, where the 2 examiner of drivers is notified by the district judge, traffic 3 violations bureaus of the district courts, or the judge of the circuit court that the applicant has failed to respond to a 5 traffic citation or summons, or failed to appear in court after 6 an arrest for the violation of any traffic laws of a county, 7 this chapter or chapter 286G, 287, 290, 291, or 291C, or of any 8 motor vehicle insurance laws under article 10C of chapter 431, 9 or of any motorcycle or motor scooter insurance laws under 10 article 10G of chapter 431, and the same remains delinquent and 11 outstanding, or the applicant, has as of the time of the 12 application, failed to comply in full with all orders of the 13 court; provided that the district court with whose order an 14 applicant has failed to comply in full, may approve the issuance 15 or renewal of a driver's license or instruction permit other 16 than a commercial driver's license upon conditions imposed by **17** the court for the satisfaction of the outstanding court order 18 and any other conditions as may be imposed by the court, if one 19 or more of the following conditions are met:

1	(1) The applicant is gainfully employed in a position that
2	requires driving and will be discharged if the
3	applicant is unable to drive; or
4	(2) The applicant has no access to alternative
5	transportation and therefore must drive to work;
6	provided further that if the applicant has failed to comply in
7	full with orders of the district court of more than one circuit,
8	the applicant shall obtain the approval of the district court of
9	each circuit in which the applicant has an outstanding court
10	order before a driver's license or instruction permit may be
11	issued or renewed under this subsection.
12	A driver's license or instruction permit issued or renewed
13	under this subsection shall be subject to immediate suspension
14	by the court upon the applicant's failure to remain in full
15	compliance with all conditions imposed by the court for the
16	issuance or renewal of the driver's license or instruction
17	permit. The examiner of drivers may place an indication of
18	restriction upon a driver's license or instruction permit issued
19	or renewed under this subsection. Proof of financial
20	responsibility under section 287-20 shall not apply to the

- 1 issuance or renewal of driver's licenses or instruction permits
- 2 under this subsection.
- 3 (d) An application for a driver's license shall include
- 4 the information required under section 11- ."
- 5 SECTION 3. Section 286-301, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 "[+] §286-301[+] Issuance of identification card or
- 8 temporary card. (a) To obtain an identification card from the
- 9 examiner of drivers, an individual shall complete an application
- 10 pursuant to section 286-303.
- 11 (b) The examiner of drivers, upon receipt of [the] an
- 12 application by any individual who is a resident or a temporary
- 13 resident of this State, shall issue an identification card to
- 14 that individual upon receipt of [any] an appropriate fee
- 15 established pursuant to section 286-309.
- 16 (c) The identification card shall be similar in size,
- 17 shape, and design to a driver's license, but shall not entitle
- 18 the individual to whom it is issued to operate a motor vehicle.
- 19 (d) The issuance of an identification card pursuant to
- 20 this section shall not place upon the State of Hawaii or any
- 21 agency any liability for the misuse or the acceptance of [the]

1 an identification card as valid identification, which shall be 2 left entirely to the discretion of any individual to whom [such] 3 an identification card is presented. 4 (e) An application for an identification card from the 5 examiner of drivers shall include the information required under 6 section 11- ." 7 SECTION 4. Section 286-311, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 9 [All] Except for the purposes of sections 11- , 10 286-109, and 286-301, information and records acquired by the 11 examiner of drivers under this part shall be confidential. All 12 information and records shall be maintained in an appropriate 13 form and in an appropriate office in the custody and under the 14 control of the examiner. The information shall be available 15 only to authorized individuals under [such] any restrictions as 16 the director shall prescribe. The examiner may dispose of any **17** application or identification card, or information or record 18 relating to the application or identification card, [which] that 19 does not include a social security number, without regard to 20 chapter 94, whenever, in the examiner's discretion, retention of 21 the information or record is no longer required or practicable."

Report Title:

Office of Elections Package; DOT; Automatic Voter Registration; Driver's Licenses; Civil Identification Cards

Description:

Establishes automatic voter registration upon application for a driver's license or civil identification card, except when an applicant affirmatively declines on an application to register to vote. Requires the examiner of drivers to electronically transmit to the Office of Elections certain information associated with currently registered and newly registered voters. Requires accessibility of certain databases maintained or operated by the Department of Transportation or the counties.

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
