

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VEHICLES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 249-5.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

2 amended to read as follows: 3 "\$249-5.5 Stored vehicles. (a) All vehicles taxable under sections 249-1, 249-2, 249-4 and 249-6 to 249-13, which 4 5 are stored so that they are not used for transportation, or for the other purposes covered by section 249-2, and which were not 6 7 kept on any public roadway, shall be exempt from the tax for the 8 period of storage; provided that the owner of each vehicle shall 9 first present to the director of finance [a signed statement of] 10 one or more signed affidavits, sworn to under oath and 11 notarized, stating the [facts of the storage, including 12 the dates of each period of storage and the approximate odometer 13 readings at the beginning and end of each period of storage, 14 together with other relevant facts as may be required by the 15 director of finance [and shall surrender the last issued 16 certificate of registration, license plates, and emblem for the 17 vehicle]. finance after] or affidavits reflect that the vehicle was in

storage for only a portion of the time that has elapsed since

the expiration of the vehicle's <u>last</u> registration period, then

the unpaid tax <u>shall</u> be collected at the rate in effect at that

time for each <u>calendar</u> month not fully included in the periods

of storage set forth in the affidavits, excluding any period in

license plates, and emblem are presented to the director of

- 9 emblem, plus the [fee] fees for the [currently issued license]
 10 plates and emblem shall be paid in full upon presenting the

affidavit.] current registration period.

- 12 (b) [The director of finance may dispose of the license
 13 plates for any vehicle whose registration has expired and the
 14 owner shall be required to purchase new license plates and a new
 15 emblem upon removing the vehicle from storage.
 - (e) As a condition precedent to the removal of the vehicle from storage, the owner of the vehicle shall present to the director of finance a certificate of inspection [that was issued after the recording of the storage with the director of finance if the certificate of inspection expired during the period of storage.] for the vehicle, issued within thirty days

- 1 before or after the date on which the affidavits are presented
- 2 to the director of finance. Failure to present the certificate
- 3 of inspection within thirty days after the date on which the
- 4 affidavits are presented to the director of finance, or a
- 5 discrepancy between the affidavits and the certificate of
- 6 inspection shall result in cancelation of the current
- 7 registration and forfeiture of all fees paid for the current
- 8 registration period."
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 10 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 11 begun before its effective date.
- 12 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
