

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 51, Session Laws
- 2 of Hawaii 2004, known as the Reinventing Education Act of 2004,
- 3 established a weighted student formula to allocate moneys to
- 4 schools according to the different costs of educating students
- 5 with different needs. Despite the intended equitable
- 6 distribution of funds, the legislature finds that the weighted
- 7 student formula has placed small, remote schools at a
- 8 disadvantage. For example, in the county of Maui, at Hana high
- 9 and elementary school, the budgetary shortfall has resulted in
- 10 the loss of several well-qualified teachers from the school.
- 11 The legislature finds that these losses have threatened the
- 12 ability of this school to offer minimum course requirements for
- 13 students to earn high school diplomas. The legislature further
- 14 finds that if Hana high and elementary school is unable to offer
- 15 its high school students the requisite courses for graduation,
- 16 those students will have to endure a nearly forty-mile, two-hour
- 17 drive to the next closest public high school.

- 1 The legislature finds that despite the current economic
- 2 situation, remote schools should be funded to retain the minimal
- 3 personnel and resources necessary to graduate students.
- 4 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to authorize
- 5 supplemental funding for remote schools.
- 6 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended by adding a new section to part V, subpart B, to be
- 8 appropriately designated and to read as follows:
- 9 "§302A- Remote schools funding. (a) Subject to
- 10 legislative appropriations, a remote school may receive
- 11 supplemental funding to support the hiring of additional
- 12 instruction and support staff.
- (b) For purposes of this section, "remote school" means
- 14 any public school, as defined in section 302A-101, that is a
- 15 high school located:
- 16 (1) At least a one-hour drive away from the next nearest
- 17 public high school; or
- 18 (2) On the islands of Lanai, Molokai, or Niihau;
- 19 provided that if a high school is combined with an elementary,
- 20 middle, intermediate, or other lower level of schooling, the
- 21 entire school shall be deemed a high school for purposes of this

1	section; provided further that this section shall not apply to
2	any charter school governed by chapter 302D."
3	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
4	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
5	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 to fund
6	remote schools pursuant to this Act.
7	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
8	education for the purposes of this Act.
9	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
10	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
