A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many affordable
 housing projects are delayed because of the State historic
 preservation division's inability to efficiently and effectively
 provide necessary reviews to ensure compliance with the State's
 historic preservation law.

6 The purpose of this Act is to authorize the counties to
7 employ qualified archaeologists to perform necessary reviews
8 under chapter 6E, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

9 SECTION 2. Section 6E-42, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10 amended to read as follows:

"\$6E-42 Review of proposed projects. (a) Except as
provided in section 6E-42.2, before any agency or officer of the
State or its political subdivisions approves any project
involving a permit, license, certificate, land use change,
subdivision, or other entitlement for use, which may affect
historic property, aviation artifacts, or a burial site, the
agency or office shall advise the department and prior to any



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1	approval a	allow the department or a qualified archaeologist
2	employed by the relevant county an opportunity for review and	
3	comment on the effect of the proposed project on historic	
4	properties, aviation artifacts, or burial sites, consistent with	
5	section 6E-43, including those listed in the Hawaii register of	
6	historic places. If:	
7	(1)	The proposed project consists of corridors or large
8		land areas;
9	(2)	Access to properties is restricted; or
10	(3)	Circumstances dictate that construction be done in
11		stages,
12	the [depar	rtment's] review and comment may be based on a phased
13	review of	the project; provided that there shall be a
14	programmat	tic agreement between the department and the project
15	applicant	that identifies each phase and the estimated timelines
16	for each p	phase.
17	(b)	The department shall inform the public of any project
18	proposals	submitted to it under this section that are not
19	otherwise	subject to the requirement of a public hearing or
20	other publ	lic notification.



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1	(c) The department shall adopt rules in accordance with
2	chapter 91 to implement this section.
3	(d) The department's review under this section may be
4	delegated to a qualified archaeologist employed by the relevant
5	county:
6	(1) Upon request by the county;
7	(2) Upon request by the entitlement applicant, with the
8	concurrence of the county agency employing the
9	archaeologist; or
10	(3) By agreement between the department and the county
11	agency employing the archaeologist.
12	(e) The proposed project shall be deemed automatically
13	approved by the state historic preservation division if the
14	necessary archaeological review is not completed within thirty
15	days.
16	(f) Challenges to any archaeological review shall be
17	subject to an expedited hearing before the supreme court."
18	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
19	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
