

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DISCRETIONARY TRANSFERS TO THE SUPREME COURT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Section 602-58, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

 "(b) The supreme court, in a manner and within the time
- 4 provided by the rules of court, may grant an application to
 5 transfer any case within the jurisdiction of the intermediate
- 6 appellate court to the supreme court upon the grounds that the
- 7 case involves:
- 8 (1) A question of first impression or a novel legal
 9 question; [ex]
- 10 (2) Issues upon which there is an inconsistency in the
 11 decisions of the intermediate appellate court or of
 12 the supreme court[-]; or
- 13 (3) An issue of child custody; provided that this

 14 paragraph shall not apply to child custody cases

 15 arising under chapter 587A."
- 16 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
