

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE IGNITION INTERLOCK PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 291E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "§291E- Ignition interlock device; negative reports.
- 5 (a) Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter to the
- 6 contrary, the requirement to have an ignition interlock device
- 7 installed in a vehicle shall continue until the person submits
- 8 to the director and the director of transportation a certificate
- 9 from the ignition interlock vendor stating that the device did
- 10 not record a negative report during the last ninety consecutive
- 11 days of the required installation period. The director shall
- 12 release the person from the ignition interlock device
- 13 requirement as soon as practicable after the director receives
- 14 the certificate.
- 15 (b) If a negative report is recorded during the last
- 16 ninety consecutive days, the person shall continue to use an
- 17 ignition interlock device until the person submits to the



- 1 director and the director of transportation a certificate from
- 2 the ignition interlock vendor stating that the device has not
- 3 recorded a negative report for ninety consecutive days,
- 4 beginning on the date of the most recent negative report.
- 5 (c) The requirements of subsection (b) shall be in
- 6 addition to any penalty required for a violation of section
- **7** 291E-66.
- 8 (d) As used in this section, "negative report" includes a
- 9 report of tampering with an ignition interlock device,
- 10 unauthorized removal of an ignition interlock device, lockout,
- 11 or a test violation recorded by an ignition interlock device."
- 12 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 13 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 14 begun before its effective date.
- 15 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
