## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 291C-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "§291C-12 Accidents involving death or serious bodily injury. (a) The driver of any vehicle involved in an accident 4 resulting in serious bodily injury to or death of any person 5 shall immediately stop the vehicle at the scene of the accident 6 7 or as close thereto as possible but shall then forthwith return 8 to and in every event shall remain at the scene of the accident 9 until the driver has fulfilled the requirements of section 10 291C-14. Every such stop shall be made without obstructing traffic more than is necessary. 11

12 (b) Any person who violates subsection (a) shall be guilty13 of a class B felony.

14 (c) The license or permit to drive and any nonresident15 operating privilege of the person so convicted shall be revoked.

(a) The driver of any vehicle involved in an accident resulting in 8 9 injury to or death of any person or damage to any vehicle or 10 other property which is driven or attended by any person shall 11 give the driver's name, address, and the registration number of 12 the vehicle the driver is driving, and shall upon request and if 13 available exhibit the driver's license or permit to drive to any 14 person injured in the accident or to the driver or occupant of or person attending any vehicle or other property damaged in the 15 16 accident and shall give such information and upon request 17 exhibit such license or permit to any police officer at the 18 scene of the accident or who is investigating the accident and 19 shall render to any person injured in the accident reasonable 20 assistance, including the carrying, or the making of arrangements for the carrying, of the person to a physician, 21

surgeon, or hospital for medical or surgical treatment if it is apparent that such treatment is necessary, or if such carrying is requested by the injured person; provided that if the vehicle involved in the accident is a bicycle, the driver of the bicycle need not exhibit a license or permit to drive.

6 In the event that none of the persons specified is in (b) 7 condition to receive the information to which they otherwise 8 would be entitled under subsection (a), and no police officer is 9 present, the driver of any vehicle involved in the accident 10 after fulfilling all other requirements of section 291C-12, 11 291C-12.5, or 291C-12.6, and subsection (a) of this section, 12 insofar as possible on the driver's part to be performed, shall 13 forthwith report the accident to the nearest police officer and 14 submit thereto the information specified in subsection (a).

15 (c) For any violation under this section, a surcharge of
16 up to \$100 may be imposed, in addition to other penalties, which
