

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MINIMUM WAGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 46, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 2 by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "\$46-A Minimum wage; counties. Each county, by ordinance,
- 5 may establish a minimum wage rate that is higher than the
- 6 minimum wage provided in section 387-2."
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 387-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 "\$387-2 Minimum wages. (a) Except as provided in section
- 10 387-9 and this section, every employer shall pay to each
- 11 employee employed by the employer, wages at the rate of not less
- 12 than:
- 13 (1) \$6.25 per hour beginning January 1, 2003;
- 14 (2) \$6.75 per hour beginning January 1, 2006;
- 15 (3) \$7.25 per hour beginning January 1, 2007;
- 16 (4) \$7.75 per hour beginning January 1, 2015;
- 17 (5) \$8.50 per hour beginning January 1, 2016;

Report Title:

City and County of Honolulu Mayor's Package; DLIR; Minimum Wage; Counties

Description:

Allows counties to set their own minimum wage at a rate that is higher than the state minimum wage rate. Increases the minimum wage in the State to \$15 per hour beginning 1/1/2020. Authorizes the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations to annually adjust the minimum hourly wage rate in accordance with the Honolulu Region Consumer Price Index beginning on 1/1/2021.
