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## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A FOOD HUB PILOT PROGRAM.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that models for 2 agricultural and food processing industries have a proven track 3 record of success. In states such as Ohio, these industries 4 contributed \$93 billion to their state's economy, creating jobs 5 that can never be outsourced. Farming and agriculture are pillars of Hawaii's economic strength. Innovation in farming, 6 7 harvesting, and processing is creating an attractive profession 8 which combines science, technology, and land use to strengthen 9 our economy and food security. Food hubs allow for families and 10 small farms to join the greater economy and allow local people 11 to benefit from markets they previously did not have access to.

12 The legislature further finds that Hawaii is the most 13 isolated, populated land mass on earth and currently relies on 14 imports for over ninety percent of its food supply. Such 15 reliance is not only costly, but also poses a significant risk 16 of famine in the event of a natural disaster, economic



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disruption, or other external factors beyond the State's
 control.

3 Additionally, the legislature finds that supporting small 4 local farmers is essential to the economic development and 5 self-reliance of the State. Developing and investing in food hubs located throughout the Hawaiian Islands can help the most 6 vulnerable members of our community and lower Hawaii's 7 8 dependence on imported foods through the production of local 9 agriculture. This Act will support local families and farms 10 with facilities for aggregation, storage, processing, 11 distribution, and marketing, which strengthens their ability to 12 participate in larger agricultural economies. Hawaii's unique 13 produce, agricultural production, and food industry have encouraged visitors to travel from around the world to taste our 14 15 locally grown products. The certified local foods coming out of 16 food hubs can be sold in local stores and restaurants, 17 stimulating the economy and allowing local farmers to profit 18 from the reputation of their harvests.

19 The legislature also finds that food hubs can support rural 20 communities and present opportunities for new generations of 21 farmers to work and live in Hawaii. Agricultural economic



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production must grow within the State to help improve Hawaii's
 economic development, overall self-sufficiency, and food
 security.

4 The legislature additionally finds that Hawaii's local 5 agricultural industry needs revitalization by bringing farmers 6 and the State together to increase local food production, create 7 jobs, and engage in successful business partnerships for 8 Hawaii's sustainable future. Investing in the increase of 9 locally grown food, by supporting the development and expansion 10 of food hubs throughout the State, will increase Hawaii's food 11 security, economic diversification, sustainability, and 12 resiliency.

13 The purpose of this Act is to establish a five-year food 14 hub pilot program, which shall be administered by the department 15 of agriculture.

16 SECTION 2. (a) There is established a five-year food hub 17 pilot program, which shall be administered by the department of 18 agriculture.

19 (b) The pilot program shall:

20 (1) Adopt the United States Department of Agriculture's
21 working definition of "food hub," which is "a



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1		centrally located facility with a business management
2		structure facilitating the aggregation, storage,
3		processing, distribution, and/or marketing of
4		locally/regionally produced food products;" and
5	(2)	Award grant funding to qualified applicants for the
6		construction of critical infrastructure to establish
7		and expand food hubs in the city and county of
8		Honolulu and each of the counties of Maui, Kauai,
9		Hawaii, including:
10		(A) Construction or improvement of facilities for
11		aggregation, washing, minimal processing,
12		packaging, cold storage, and other value-added
13		facilities; and
14		(B) Provision of technical assistance to develop in-
15		state capacity to supply state institutions and
16		other markets.
17	(c)	The department of agriculture shall establish criteria
18	for the a	ward of initial start-up grant funding or subsequent
19	expansion	funding under the pilot program, including the
20	following	provisions:



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1	(1)	Priority shall be given to organizations with
2		demonstrated experience in aggregation, washing,
3		minimal processing, packaging, cold storage, and other
4		value-additions for delivering local produce to local
5		markets;
6	(2)	Qualifying applicants shall include limited liability
7		companies, for-profit organizations, non-profit
8		organizations, and agricultural cooperatives with
9		requisite insurance requirements for delivering local
10		produce to local markets;
11	(3)	Applicants seeking to launch new establishment of food
12		hubs in areas where none currently exist shall have
13		first secured a physical location for the food hub and
14		drafted a detailed plan for the food hub's operation,
15		including activities that the applicant intends to
16		engage in, such as serving as a marketplace for buying
17		and selling, or providing certified kitchen space in
18		which multiple farmers may share use of facilities for
19		value-added product development; and
20	(4)	Applicants shall explain their intended actions to
21		increase access to locally produced food.

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1 The department of agriculture shall adopt rules (d) pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for the 2 3 administration and operation of the pilot program. The department of agriculture shall submit 4 SECTION 3. (a) 5 interim reports on: 6 The department's progress in implementing this Act; (1)7 Preliminary results of the food hub pilot program; and (2) 8 The department's findings and recommendations, (3) 9 including any proposed legislation, 10 to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the 11 convening of the regular sessions of 2021, 2022, 2023, and 2024. 12 The department shall submit a final report of its (b) 13 findings and recommendations, including any proposed 14 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior 15 to the convening of the regular session of 2025. The report 16 shall include the results of the food hub pilot program and a 17 recommendation as to whether the program should be made 18 permanent, with or without modifications. 19 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 21 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for



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the establishment of a five-year food hub pilot program,
 including the awarding of grant moneys to qualifying food hubs.
 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
 agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2112.



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**Report Title:** HDOA; Food Hub Pilot Program; Grant Funding; Appropriation

#### Description:

Requires the Department of Agriculture to establish a five-year food hub pilot program to increase access to local food. Provides for the award of grant funding by qualified applicants wishing to establish or expand a food hub. Requires reports to the legislature. Appropriates funds. Takes effect on 7/1/2112. (HD1)

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
