RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I		
2	SECTION 1. Chapter 261, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
3	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
4	and to read as follows:		
5	"§261- Helicopters; commercial purposes; instrument		
6	rating. (a) No person may operate a helicopter for commercial		
7	purposes within this State without a valid instrument rating		
8	from the Federal Aviation Administration.		
9	(b) Any individual who operates a helicopter in violation		
10	of this section and any employer for whom the individual		
11	operates the helicopter shall each be subject to penalties under		
12	section 261-21(a)(2)."		
13	PART II		
14	SECTION 2. The legislature finds that helicopter crashes		
15	and resulting deaths continue to be a matter of public concern		
16	in Hawaii. There have been eighteen civilian helicopter crashes

- 1 in Hawaii since 2015, occurring on Oahu, Hawaii island, Kauai,
- 2 and Molokai.
- 3 Hawaii residents are not only concerned with the dangers
- 4 associated with helicopter crashes, such as the December 2019
- 5 crash on Kauai or the April 2019 crash on a residential street
- 6 in Kailua, but also with issues related to helicopter noise,
- 7 frequency, and altitude. These concerns related to helicopters
- 8 in Hawaii remain largely unresolved. The legislature believes
- 9 that requiring helicopter owners and operators to report basic
- 10 details of helicopter flights will help provide necessary
- 11 information to stakeholders and community members in order to
- 12 find a meaningful resolution to this area of concern.
- Accordingly, the purpose of this part is to require
- 14 helicopter owners and operators to submit monthly reports about
- 15 basic helicopter flight information.
- 16 SECTION 3. Chapter 261, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 18 and to read as follows:

11	(4)	Whether the helicopter deviated from its flight plan,
12		including an explanation of why the deviation

14	(c)	The report required pursuant to this section shall be
15	submitted	by 4:30 p.m. on the fifteenth day of the month
16	following	the month for which the report is required.
17	<u>(d)</u>	The department shall post the reports required under
18	subsectio	n (a) to its website within one week of receipt of the
19	report fr	om a helicopter owner or operator.
20	<u>(e)</u>	The failure to submit a report to the department and
21	the advis	ory committee of the county from which the helicopter

- 2 constitute a violation of this chapter, and the owner or
- 3 operator of the helicopter shall be subject to the penalties
- 4 established pursuant to section 261-21."

- 6 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 7 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 8 begun before its effective date.
- 9 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Report Title:

Helicopters; Operation; Instrument Rating; Penalty; Reporting; DOT; County Advisory Committees

Description:

Prohibits the operation of a helicopter for commercial purposes without a valid instrument rating from the Federal Aviation Administration. Subjects both a violating individual and an individual's employer to penalties. Requires helicopter owners and operators to submit reports to the department of transportation and the appropriate county advisory committee about basic helicopter flight information. Takes effect on 7/1/2050. (Proposed HD2)
